School Impact

Sometimes events are beyond our control. Especially when it's time for school dismissal and you're in the midst of having 26" inches of snow dropped wreaking havoc on transportation and getting the kids home. While some of our kids were on their busses past 11:00 PM (we thank God for those bus drivers!), there were also a group of students, parents, and faculty that waited it out at the school overnight. This is a brief chronicle of students and parents who experienced this event. We'll start with Rosey Swiger, an 8th grade student, who wished to share her experience with you. Following that we'll share a few quotes and excerpts from social media from parents. Through it all we thank God for his safety and provisions, and also to the faculty who chose to remain.

"Make Believe Stories Can be Real"

I remember growing up as a kid I would continuously say things like "what if we got stuck at school?" and "what if we had to sleep at school?" I used to laugh at the thought of that ever happening. So you can imagine my shock when I discovered that all those childish thoughts were about to become true.

In my english and social studies classroom (the one off the back of the gym) there is a very big window that shows the whole backyard of our school. We come into class around 1:30 and I remember it was beginning to snow. As time went on, the snow began to increase in speed and in the amount coming down. By 2:15 it was one big blanket of white in front of our window. It was getting hard to pay attention to what we learning because it was fascinating to see that much snow accumulated that fast. By 2:50, when we get ready to go home, the snow had not stopped coming. A few kids had been picked up by their parents a few minutes early because the roads were starting to get bad. It was around 3:15 and there were still a group of kids waiting for our parents and buses to pick us up. I remember not being too worried because I thought the plows would be able to clear the roads in time and my mom could pick me up and take me home. I did begin to worry when it was a clually really fun. I had a good time running around with the little kids. Around 5:30, I decided to call my mom. She told me that there was no way she could get on the road and that I was going to have to sleep at school. I was actually in shock. We ended up sleeping in my classroom! We watched movies until the younger kids fell asleep. It took my brain a little bit to adjust to the fact that I had to sleep at school. I finally got comfortable and fell fast asleep.

When I woke up the teachers had made breakfast. I found out that my mom was coming and I was able to go home. I could never be more grateful for the kindness the teachers showed toward us. They made everything feel better. I most likely would have been scared and upset if they hadn't been there. It is something I will never forget. All those made up stories about possibly having to stay overnight at school actually came true. In the end, those make believe stories can be real. :0
