# "From Bullying to Jesus" ~ School Impact

For the last week and a half I've had the 7th and 8th grade working in pairs putting a presentation together using Google Slides sharing how God has helped them through difficult times. Yesterday it came time for them to present their work to the class and ultimately they'd be sharing with the 5th and 6th grade students. While they were all neat to hear and see (I love hearing what God does in the lives of people!), there is one I thought particularly inspiring to share with you because it has to do with God and the awesome things He does through our school. I love how the student, Rosey, can see the big picture and give God the glory for what He's done in her life in this particular instance.

September is always an exciting month. School is starting, new school supplies, and you finally get to see your friends again. Last school year, 2015-2016, was not one I was looking forward too. I had just ended 6<sup>th</sup> grade and was not looking forward to 7<sup>th</sup>. Throughout 6<sup>th</sup> grade was constant drama. My grades dropped, and I felt like I was losing all my friends. I would come into class not sure if my "friends" were mad at me or not. It was one of the worst feelings.

I felt like no one cared or understood how I was truly feeling. I hated this but I thought there was nothing I could do but hope it would all pass over. Unfortunately, that did not happen. I lost one of my best friends. The school year dragged on, and I felt useless. Then during the summer after 6<sup>th</sup> grade, things got worse. I was starting to get bullied online.

I had been looking forward to a fun summer. I went to California for two weeks; it was difficult to have fun because of the negative texts and comments I continued to receive. I had no idea what to do. My mom saw the text messages and was just as angry and hurt as me. The school that I had been going to for 7 years no longer felt like home. I didn't want to go there any longer. I was hurt and felt alone.

I applied for another school and received a notice that I had gotten in. It was a charter school, which was a change because I had gone to a private school all my life; I hoped this would change things. I was shocked to see the kid's attitude towards school. They seemed to have no respect for the teachers.

As time went I realized that my attitude was changing also. I no longer cared about my grades or others. I cared about myself and what others thought of me. Jesus, and the true word of God, no longer even crossed my mind. I felt myself drifting from my true friends and family. I found myself in more drama than ever before. I realized that the people I thought were my friends were the ones talking about me. By then I didn't even know what a friend was. I again got bullied online. By now, I felt completely lost. I thought nobody honestly cared.

Around April of 2016, my mom took me out of the charter school. Just like me, she felt angry, upset and confused. My mom put me in a new school. A Christian school. I was honestly very scared. I wasn't sure if people were going to like me, or if I would fit in. I remember walking in, and just smiling. I saw a huge painting of Jesus with his arms open, and I just remember feeling so happy inside. It was one of the first times I felt that happy in a while.

I was introduced to so many people that are still my best friends today. I realized the true meaning of friend. One of the biggest changes that are still affecting me is my relationship with Jesus. I had been away from him for so long that I forgot everything I learned. I honestly didn't think God would want me back. But with the help from my teachers and friends I realized how totally wrong I was. I realized God did love and care about me. I realized he wanted me in his life. This change had a huge effect on me.

I finally feel loved again. I have true friends that are amazing. I have never been this happy. When I thought I was lost, God found me again. I thought he was putting me on a path to nowhere. But in the end, he put me on a path to Trinity. I now attend a local youth group every Tuesday night where I feel safe to talk about my problems. They too have helped me in my change so much. It's scary to think that around this time last year I was alone and lost. Now I'm at Trinity I feel found and at last... I'm home.
