"THE FIVE-HUNDREDTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE REFORMATION!"

This year, especially this Fall, we are celebrating the 500th Anniversary of the nailing of Luther's 95 Theses to the church door in Wittenburg, Germany. Many see this as the beginning of the Reformation that unfolded and evolved over the next several decades. The Reformation was not about a new theology per se, but about returning to the unchanged and unchanging truth of God's Word. So it remains for us today. The celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation is not a time for novelty. It is a time to review and perhaps return to the truth, the basics, the foundation of our faith.

I'm sure most of you remember the Small Catechism. Many of us were made to memorize the catechism (or at least part of it) during our Confirmation classes. Some of us might have even suffered through a public examination over its contents. How much do you still remember? It's time to remember and emphasize the basic truths and teachings of God's Word. Luther wrote the Small Catechism for the instruction of laypeople. He intended the Small Catechism to be used at church and in the home to instruct children in the faith and to reinforce the faith in the hearts and minds of adults. The catechism teaches the fundamentals of the Christian faith: the Ten Commandments, the Lord's Prayer, the Apostles' Creed, the Sacrament of Baptism, the Sacrament of the Altar and the Office of the Keys and Confession. This small book is well worth your time to re-read and study. It still serves as a basis for teaching the faith today!

This Fall we are going to take an overview look at the Reformation movement in our Sunday morning Bible classes, specifically Dr. Martin Luther: The Man; The Moment; The Movement. After that, probably this next winter, we will review Luther's Small Catechism. Hopefully many of you will join us on Sundays at 9:15am to review and celebrate the blessing of the Reformation!



On Martin Luther's birthday, Friday evening November 10th, we will gather together at the Orchard Park Country Club for a special program remembering Dr. Luther and the Reformation. Noted author and historian, Dr. Paul Maier will speak about the continued significance of the Reformation 500 years later. This should really be a very special evening that you won't want to miss! If interested in attending this function you <u>MUST</u> sign up on the 'sign-up' sheet in the church narthex or email Teresa in the church office. Seating is limited and invitations have gone out to the area Lutheran churches. If you just show up that night and did not make a reservation, you could possibly be out of luck! Reservations are on a first come first serve basis.

May this celebration of the 500^{th} anniversary of the Reformation be a time when we recommit ourselves to the basic truth of God's Word and Sacraments, and turn to Christ and His love. It's *still* all about Jesus.

Trinity School News

From the Principal ...

Many congregations and schools have developed or are establishing Endowment Funds. Trinity, both church and school, are implementing endowment programs to help ensure the continuation of the facilities and mission that were first established over 150 years ago. Trinity, however, has actively been involved in endowment since the school began! Dear brothers and sisters, your "endowment" to your school has reaped, and continues to produce, benefits far beyond our comprehension. The thousands of students who have walked these halls heard the Gospel message over and over, saw examples of Christian living everyday in the staff and volunteers, and learned what it means to be a child of God. Of course, not all students accepted or embraced that message. However, we cannot fathom how many lives have been touched by the word or example of our staff and students.

A recent study showed that a large majority of public servants (including politicians) in the Chicago area attended parochial or private schools. The leadership, accountability and respect they experienced everyday in those schools led them towards lives of public service. How many of our students went on to be Christian leaders, either in the public or private sector, or Christian parents, supporting and perpetuating the Gospel in both children and adults? We don't know, but we DO know that Trinity Lutheran Church and School has affected thousands of lives here in Western New York and probably nationally, as well. We know that we have supported our teacher missionaries throughout the years, brought children and families to faith through the hearing of the Word, and trained Christian leaders for communities across the country. That is an AMAZING endowment!

Your school is growing! With that growth comes additional responsibilities and challenges, and even greater opportunity to fulfill your mission. I know that there are limited opportunities for "hands on" in the school, but this year, I am going to ask the congregation to consider taking a greater responsibility for the actual sharing of the Word among our school families. While many of our school families are active church goers and, through them, we are building "better" disciples, there is also tremendous opportunity for making "more" disciples among those families who are not actively living as Christians or don't even know what that means. This is a very challenging request! Pastor Krueger, the school staff, your Outreach committee, the Board of Christian Education and I will be looking at ways that all of us and you, as a congregation and disciples, can personally engage with our school families in meaningful Christian conversation. Are you willing? Will you prayerfully consider being involved with reaching out to our families who have yet to experience the joy of a life in Christ? Our first priority at the school is to be the vehicle to provide the Word to as many people as possible, and we can be most effective with your help!

l am daily blessed to work among the incredible school staff and volunteers and the loving people of this congregation. Please continue to pray for your school, support it generously, and prayerfully consider how you can be "hands on" through word or action within the school itself, through volunteering or as a family missionary. Health Ministry: Flu Vaccines

The best time to get the flu vaccine is late September to October according to William Schaffner, MD and professor of preventative medicine and infectious diseases, but if you are traveling or think you might forget to get the vaccine, do it sooner. It takes at lease two weeks for antibodies to develop to fight off the flu. There will NOT be a clinic here at Trinity because the VNA has discontinued its flu clinic services due to the high number of drug stores offering the vaccine. Ask you primary doctor about the shingles vaccine, or if you have asthma or other breathing problems or are 65+, ask about getting a pneumonia vaccine.

Thank you again to those who participated. Trinity truly is blessed! It is amazing to see how many of our members are currently using their time and talents to further the ministry of Trinity Lutheran Church and School as well as those who have shown an interest in hearing more about a particular ministry. The survey results have been compiled and reports have been distributed to the various ministry/committee chairs. What's Wrong with This Picture?

Have you noticed anything different in front of church? Yes, the stained glass is missing! At a cost of about \$20,000 we're finally getting the badly needed repairs done. The stained glass was buckling so badly the repair man said we were lucky (blessed!) they didn't actually break. He also mentioned they were of very high quality. They'll be gone for a few months while being worked on and then reinstalled once finished.

How does it feel missing them in front of church? It's one of those things that you don't really appreciate or realize the impact they have until they are gone. Yes, we are blessed that long before we were alive, our forefathers designed and intended these to be an enhancement to our worship. All praise to God!

But the work isn't over and neither is the cost to repair them. Currently Trinity members and friends have given about \$12,400 and we still need \$7,600 more. If you can even chip in \$50 or \$75 that'd be a great help. Please help us ensure the look of our worship space for generations to come!

Trinity Teens and Friends Get a Clue!



Trinity School Exciting News!

"God is doing something great at Trinity..." These words were shared on June 15, by the graduation speaker, Chris Kopra (2003 grad.), who addressed the 2017 graduating class and school families. Little did he know that with our closing ceremony that evening, we would begin a new school year 2 months later with God doing exactly that. So much has happened within those two months we want to give God the praise and shout those good things from the roof tops!

First, our **K-8 enrollment has increased from last year by over 20%!** Personal testimony, encouragement and word of mouth continue to be our best advertisement. Our school family (parents) is not only made up of owners of local businesses, presidents of businesses and professional sport team staff, but also stay at home moms and dads, home school families who decided to give Trinity a try, church/ministry worker parents, public school teachers, families that wanted something other than what public school was offering or the experience they were receiving, those that want a Christian Education but can't afford it, and those who put Christian education as a first priority. Simply, Trinity is a ministry that shares the love of Jesus through the process of education.

Next, the June **Business First 2017 Schools Guide** has ranked Trinity #17 out of 194 (top 9%) middle schools, ranking higher than Orchard Park, St. John Vianney, Hamburg, and Christian Central Academy to name a few (we were only one point lower than East Aurora). They gave us a 91.7%. We rank 8 out of 43 private schools. Their ratings are taken from four years of collected data.

Our Pre-K age three program has grown from 2 to 7 students! That's a 350% growth. Our preschool program is what helps feed into the rest of our school (K-8). The class this year will be separate from the four year olds for the first time this program started 3 years ago! We are growing and expanding.

Our **school bathroom** upgrades are almost completed! The construction guys and Dave Sirgey (school board president) have been hard at it for a month now. Come and see the new bathrooms and new handicap accessible bathroom next to the school office - big difference! Thanks to Dave and all the folks that volunteered their time (many, many hours) to help keep the cost down.

It's the long-term goal of the school to **become more self supporting financially**. This will in turn allow the church to broaden it's Gospel reach through it's growing ministries such as the work in Haiti, Stephen Ministry, Youth and Families, Sunday School, Children's Church, VBS (what a week it was!), etc. For the last two years, the school accomplished that goal of coming under budget - sharing back with the church some of what it brought in financially.

There's certainly much to be thankful for, especially in a time where Christian churches, schools, camps and ministries are shrinking, struggling and closing. God will continue to do "something great" through Trinity Church and School. It is not us, but Him. Thank you for allowing God to work through you and your continued support of this 164 year ministry. He is doing **great things** through you!



Did You Catch the Eclipse?

Recently there was an eclipse and the moon went in front of the sun, blocking some of the light from shining down. I kind of compare the sun being like God and the moon is like sin and the devil. The Bible says, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but will have the light of life." John 8:12. Haiti Mission Trip August 2017

We hope that many of you have been able to follow our team's daily activities while in Haiti via the Facebook L.I.F.E. page or via email. There are many photos on Facebook, we encourage you to look! After one week in 95+ degree heat, our team safely returned home on August 9th. Time was spent serving the Upper Room Orphanage as well as two families in Fovo - a farming community about 1 hour outside of the country's capital. In Fovo, we joined with Fair Haven Baptist Church of Michigan to break ground with pick axes and shovels preparing the foundation of two homes. On our second work day in Fovo, we were able to lay much of the foundation of one of the homes. Despite lacking machinery, it was amazing to see what many helping hands were able to accomplish over the course of two days! We learned that one of the homes would house eight people!

Our days spent with the Upper Room were incredible. The children were treated to a beach excursion during which they each received their own bottle of pop. One of the special moments of the trip was watching the children sit shoulder to shoulder on a wall ledge overlooking the ocean drinking their pop and just taking it all in. That day concluded with cinnamon buns on the bus ride home as well! Another day was spent at the orphanage hosting a VBS program themed around Noah's Ark. Many of the local school children were able to join in the fun and devotions as well. On Sunday we were once again able to worship with Mama, Papa, and the children at the Mission of Hope Campus Church.

Seeing the children of the Upper Room and having new Trinity Church members build relationships with them was truly heartwarming. Since returning, our group members have to cope with not only missing the children, but the drastic differences between our two worlds. As difficult as that may be, the experience of showing love to those children made it all worth it. The children, Mama, and Papa all know why we were there, and *Who* we were there on behalf of - Jesus Christ. Being able to make them smile, hold them, and give a hug in His name brings true joy and covers any sorrow.

Please know on behalf of Papa Josy and Mama Kerlin how grateful they are for you and your support. Our monthly sponsors relieve the incredible burden of worrying how many meals the children will receive and whether they can afford to pay teachers for school. The countless donations received for this mission trip allowed us to provide the special days we spent with children.
