“Thank-You Lord!”

I recently read a story about a fourth-grade class that was given the seasonally traditional assignment of writing a short essay on thankfulness. Eric surprised his teacher by writing that he was most thankful for his glasses. “My glasses,” explained Eric, “keep the boys from punching me, and the girls from kissing me.” As we approach this national holiday, for what are you thankful? Are you thankful for your spouse, your children, your job, your health, or your friends? Maybe you are thankful for something far less important than any of those, like what is parked in your garage or what is bringing the football game into your living room. We can learn a lesson from young Eric. He did not complain about the inconvenience of wearing glasses or the teasing they might have brought him. Instead, he found something good in them, something for which to be thankful. The next time you catch yourself complaining about the mortgage or rent, thank God you have a place in which to live. Instead of griping about your children’s dental bills, be thankful that God has blessed with the gift of children.

You see, Thanksgiving is not just a holiday. Thanksgiving is not just a day to be stuffed with turkey and filled with football. Thanksgiving is an *attitude*. Thanksgiving is an attitude that realizes we do not deserve any of the things we call our own. No matter how many years we have spent in school or how hard we have worked, all we have is an undeserved gift from God’s gracious hand. Whether it’s food, clothing, shelter, the blessings of family or good friends, God just keeps on giving! We have not even mentioned the greatest gift that God has given us either. In that well-known verse (John 3:16) we read: “God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.”

Jesus—our Savior from sin, death, and hell—is the greatest reason we have to give thanks to the Lord. With Jesus, we have everything, even if we own nothing. Through our gift of faith that Jesus died for us, we have many other wonderful gifts from God. We have the assurance that our sins are forgiven, the peace of a good conscience, the joy of living in Christ, the confidence that God hears and answers our prayers, and the certainty of an eternal home in heaven. We have so much for which to be thankful.

One way that we can express our thanks to the Lord is by worshiping him. For that reason, we will have a worship service to celebrate our national day of Thanksgiving on the Eve of Thanksgiving, November 22nd, at 7:00 p.m. Please join us for worship and to give “thanks” to the Lord. Other ways you can express your thanks to the Lord is by bringing gifts of nonperishable food items for those individuals and families who could use a little extra help. We will donate the food items to the Buffalo City Mission and/or other local food pantries. Should you know of anyone in our congregation who could use some assistance in this way, please contact me. All names will remain anonymous. There are, of course, many other causes and needs that you might consider giving a thank-you gift to this month as well.

When the Apostle Paul commended the Thessalonians for their gifts of love and thanksgiving, he especially noted how they gave “themselves” to the Lord. Donating food, giving money, and volunteering your time are great, but let us follow the example of the church members in Thessalonica and give ourselves first in thanks-living!

Trinity School News



From the Principal ...

Dear Friends,

Now that we're settled into the school year, the new students are acclimated and the teachers are getting to used to classrooms that are considerably fuller, I'd love to share some information about your school that you may not know and hopefully find interesting!

We currently have 97 students enrolled in PK3 - 8th grade. This is the first year that our 3 year-old enrollment has allowed us to have a separate Pre-K classroom in the church, for which we are extremely appreciative. All of our students in 5th-8th grades have their own HP Chromebooks (laptops) to use on a daily basis; 3rd & 4th grades have their own laptops, and PK - 2nd have tablets in the classrooms. All classrooms have SMART boards, which are used regularly. Two classrooms have document cameras. All of our textbooks are current, with Social Studies being new this year. All of our textbooks, except science (next year) have an online option for student use - all of the textbook content and additional activities are available to them at any time. Several online sites provide academic skills practice for the students of all grades, and students use them in school and at home. LEGO products, for STEM and coding instruction, have been purchased and will be implemented in January. All students in PK-8 receive instruction in the core subjects, religion, music, art, physical education and Spanish. Piano and percussion lessons are available for 2nd-8th grades. This year, Trinity will field co-ed soccer and volleyball teams, as well as varsity and junior varsity boys and girls basketball teams. Several other extra-curricular activities and clubs are offered throughout the year.

Our first quarter offerings, over \$200 so far, are designated to Haiti and the LIFE team. We participated in a Thrivent event to provide cleaning supplies for Habitat for Humanity, and will be utilizing Thrivent Action Teams throughout the year. The school has paid off 75% of the \$40,000+ bill for the bathroom construction and renovations so far. We hosted a speaker from Lutheran Bible Translators, and will support them with our second quarter offerings. Our Veterans will be recognized in chapel on November 1st. The Prayer Partner Program is again in place. The third-grade students in Sunday School and day school will be presented with their Bibles in January. We hosted over 120 grandparents and friends for our Grandparents' Day Breakfast and chapel.

This is just a sampling of what is happening in your school. Most importantly, every aspect of academics, service and community is saturated with the love of our Savior, and that is TRULY what your school is all about. This is our National Lutheran Schools Accreditation year, so your Board of Christian Education, the school staff, the Pastor and I will be documenting all this, and so much more, to provide the national committee with the information necessary to allow not only all of us but the public too, to know with certainty that Trinity Christian School, every day, is Making More and Better Disciples for Jesus Christ.

Trinity's Stephen Ministry Q & A

What is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a system through which members of Trinity are trained and organized to help provide Christian caregiving to members of our congregation and community. This will multiply the amount of caring ministry Trinity can provide by giving us a whole team of skilled caregivers who are equipped to bring Christ's healing love to people who are grieving, in crisis, or experiencing other stresses in life.

Why Stephen Ministry?

We have many needs of care in our congregation and community: people experiencing divorce, grief, a terminal illness, loss of a job, relocation, an empty nest, retirement, hospitalization, loneliness, and many other stresses or challenges. Often people with needs suffer silently or do not request or receive the level of care they really need. With only one pastor for our congregation, you can quickly see why it would be impossible for him to meet every single need of every single person. Stephen Ministry expands the care Trinity can offer by equipping and organizing members to provide Christian care. This gives us a large pool of people with the gifts, skills, and calling to bring Christ's love and care to those who most need it.

Who Benefits from Stephen Ministry?

Everybody! Those receiving care from Stephen Ministers benefit because they receive prayer and support throughout the crisis they face. Stephen Ministers benefit through the spiritual growth they experience from being involved in meaningful ministry. Our pastor benefits because caring ministry at Trinity is expanded, and fewer people will slip through the cracks. Most of all **you** benefit from the knowledge that special care is available to you should you need it. In addition, you now have a place where you can refer a friend, neighbor, coworker, relative, or anyone else you know who is going through a difficult time so that they can receive special care when they need it most. Stephen Ministry makes Trinity a much more caring place!

DOES THE CHURCH NEED ANOTHER REFORMATION?

We have just celebrated the 500th anniversary of the Reformation on October 31st commemorating Martin Luther's posting of the 95 Theses. Even though the Reformation was about a whole lot more than the 95 Theses, most scholars point to that event as the beginning of the Protestant Reformation.

Overall, the Reformation was about:

- 1) The Primacy of God's Word for life and doctrine in the church. God's Word, Holy Scripture, is the only rule, norm and final authority in the church. God's Word takes precedence above church constitutions and bylaws, church writings, quotes from famous authors and venerable church leaders, individuals, church councils and conventions.
- 2) The Priesthood of all believers, also called the Royal Priesthood. The holy Christian church is not a gathering of the elite nor is it a club of scholars or rostered workers. God hears the prayers of all the baptized. Their lives of service do matter. All the baptized are equal in the eyes of God...the priest, the mother, the baker and so forth. All of God's people are bearers of God's Word. A simple layman speaking a simple Word of God has more authority than a well-versed scholarly theologian equipped with a religious library, but without Scripture.
- 3) Church in the language of the people. Luther and all the Reformers labored in order that the common person in the pews could understand worship and participate fully in the liturgy and understand the proclamation of the Gospel. Luther translated Scriptures into the language of the people. He wrote scores of hymns and even set them to tunes that were borrowed from the local pub.

In some ways, the church is always in need of reformation. It can be argued that the church today, even the Lutheran Church, needs another Reformation. Why would someone suggest such a thing?

YES, THE CHURCH NEEDS ANOTHER REFORMATION!

The Church needs another Reformation when:

- 1) We hear less of God's Word quoted in church circles than of the man-made agreements that bind us. We've grown into a fanciful group of sweet storytellers rather than proclaimers of Law and Gospel - to "*know nothing among you but Jesus Christ and Him crucified*". Jesus is mentioned from the pulpits as an afterthought rather than the whole thought. And attendance at Adult Bible Classes is deplorable, less than 20% of the average Sunday morning worship.
- 2) Gifts and talents of all the people of God outside of the church are not employed inside the church. The full stewardship of time, talent and treasure are out of touch with Biblical mission activity and external church focus. Leadership, worship activity and spiritual life development of the congregation are reserved for clergy-elite. There is little equipping of the saints to be seen for works of ministry.
- 3) Worship is less spiritual, less uplifting and less understandable and is more historical, more cultural and more routine. We have grown tired of well prepared and delivered messages preferring today's brief happy messages and clever illustrations. One hour for worship out of 168 hours a week is asking too much.

Truth is, ours is a wonderful and merciful God who forgives us and invites us to His banqueting table of grace. "Come to me all who are weak and heavy laden and I will give you rest" declared our Savior. May God's Holy Spirit work in us to be the church God desires, according to His will, having the mind of Christ. Lead us to be that church and, where we might be a hurdle, may God work toward His end.
