

School News





December flew by here at school, as usual, with a concert, a pageant, parties, gifts, decorations, and of course, lots of learning. Thank you to all of you who participated in our celebrations and helped to make them even more special by your presence. As we start the new year, the agenda is full with many of the usual (and some not so usual!) activities for which to prepare.

Three events are looming large over the next few months: our 3rd Annual Fund Drive, the Spaghetti Dinner and Theme Basket Raffle, and NLSA Accreditation. Before any of those events occur, the last week in January is Lutheran Schools Week, followed by Taste of Trinity on January 28th. As you can imagine, the staff, PTO and I are all keeping our lists in order to guarantee that, first and foremost, the children continue to receive high quality academics and Christ-centered care!

We have reached our Annual Fund Drive goal the past two years, and we pray that God will allow us to continue that pattern this year, with your help. We are especially targeting our alumni this year, so if you are an alumna, please consider sharing the school FaceBook page with your friends and helping us spread the word about the excellent programs happening here. Some of this year's Annual Fund collection will purchase a phone system for the school (as we don't even have one,) upgrade and add safety equipment, and expand our student technology hardware and software even further.

The Spaghetti Dinner is our primary tuition assistance resource. All school families will be asked to participate in this event by donating baskets, selling tickets and assisting with running it in some capacity. We're determined to make this a major event with extensive community and congregational participation. Please mark March 10 (as of now) on your calendars and plan to attend!

National Lutheran Schools Accreditation is a rigorous program involving all aspects of the school and church, including mission and purpose, curriculum, personnel, student services, administration and facilities. The high standards of NLSA are the equivalent of Middle States Accreditation and are among the highest nationally. The staff and Board must put in very large amounts of time to accurately document all of the requirements, and earning our reaccreditation under the new system will be extremely rewarding for both the school and church, just as our previous accreditations were!

As always, you are welcome to visit/tour the school, come and ask questions, or participate in events at any time. I understand and deeply appreciate the commitment of the congregation to the school, and we strive to make it a place where you are welcome and enjoy being involved. God's blessings in the New Year!
