"FROM GETHSEMANE TO GOLGOTHA TO THE EMPTY GARDEN TOMB"

Sometimes I wonder why the Garden of Gethsemane is included in the Gospels. Frankly, it's easy to misunderstand. Jesus is struggling, sweating profusely, so torn up inside, so exposed, so human.

At first glance, Jesus seems weak, actually asking the Father to help him back out of the plan forged in heaven before the beginning of time. Is he afraid to die? Many brave men and women have faced death, even difficult deaths. Is he weaker than they? The answer, I believe, can be discovered in Jesus' own words.

"For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many."

"For many." The phrase seems strange until you realize that Jesus is recalling those same words found twice in Isaiah 53, the chapter that prophesies Jesus' death for our sins.

"After the suffering of his soul, he will see the light of life and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities.... He bore the sin of many and made intercession for the transgressors."

These sayings teach us that, as Jesus looked forward to his own death, he understood it as a ransom, that is, a payment to set others free. He also saw his death as bearing the sins of many -- our sins. Sin isn't pretty -- or petty. Oh, our world dresses it up as cleverness, as happiness, as fulfillment. But despite its many deceitful faces, sin at its root is about asserting power.

It is rebellion against God's authority, an undermining of his Kingdom. Sin is turning up our nose at God and doing what we want in spite of what he says -- and there's nothing pretty about that. Occasionally, when I sin, God gives me eyes to see how desperate, how corrupt, how utterly bankrupt I am in my sin. Jesus' mission that accepted was to bear my ugly sins. And then yours. And then multiply that by billions and billions -- "the sin of many."

From before the beginning, the Son and the Father have enjoyed each other's incomprehensible presence and unity. But the cross utterly shatters that fellowship, because God's holiness cannot cohabitate with sin. The unity of the Holy Trinity is certainly not fractured, but sorely stressed in the bodily death of the Son. I think it's that specter that disturbs Jesus so deeply in Gethsemane - being forsaken by his Father, even if for a short time. And revulsion at what sin will do to him, who knew no sin. He faces our multiplied sins, heaped up upon him to no end. So Jesus pleads in the Garden, "Father, is there no other way?" He cries out, he searches, he asks in a bold intimacy. And then he surrenders afresh: "Not my will, but yours." Not my desire to avoid desolation, and sin, and corruption, but your difficult and only way to save the people we love. Jesus models for us disciples what it means to follow, to obey even when we don't fully understand. From Gethsemane to Golgotha to the Empty Garden Tomb let us follow our gracious Savior and Lord!

From the Principal ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



Change is difficult, isn't it? We're comfortable in the little world we've surrounded ourselves with, and intrusions into our zone are not very welcome. And yet, we are constantly challenged by those intrusions, like health issues, family challenges, politics, shootings, and more. And on top of all that, we are called on to witness to others, love our neighbors, and be good stewards. So much for comfort! Change is essential for our growth and effectiveness as Christians. If we're comfortable, we're not doing that which Christ called us to do. And that makes God's faithfulness and His constancy all the more precious to us: He is the only One we can count on to never change and to always love us.

Here at school, the constant need to adapt to new challenges and grow in His name proves difficult at times! Sometimes I'd just like to able to relax a bit and let the school run on its own momentum. But NO! God has not called us to be only observers, has He? March will keep us on our toes as the staff and I continue to work on the monumental task of NLSA reaccreditation, organizing the Spaghetti Dinner and Basket Raffle (thank you, parents!), prepare 3rd quarter report cards, and most importantly, keep our students, their needs, and our Lenten journey together at the forefront of our endeavors. It's very exciting to see how God is working in the hearts and lives of our students and families, and provides the best motivation to continue our efforts.

Our third Annual Fund Drive is beginning soon, and our goal for this year is \$18,000! The annual fund supports capital improvements at the school that we could otherwise not afford (like new window shades and carpet removal), it provides funding for technology like chrome books and robotics kits, and is paying for enhanced safety features, like fire escape windows and a school-wide telephone and announcement system. A percentage will also be put toward the school endowment fund. Your support is so important - not only through giving, if you are able, but especially through prayer and your encouragement to fellow members, alumni, and other friends of Trinity who may not know about the school or understand its mission. The young Christian leaders that the school is training today will be our church and community leaders of the future!

Please look for the Spaghetti Dinner sign-up board in the narthex if you are able to provide food items, supplies or a basket for the auction. Tickets are available through the school office or after worship on Sundays. We'd love to have you join us for this delicious event! The proceeds will support the scholarship fund, in our ongoing effort to provide Christian education to families who may not be able to afford it and increase our tuition base.

It's enrollment time! Please prayerfully consider Trinity Christian School for your child. We now provide separate 3 and 4 year old preschool classes, and along with our departmentalized 5th-8th grades, are moving toward 1/2 day single classes in grades 1-4. "I HEARD IT THROUGH THE GRAPEVINE!"

When Jesus spoke to His followers about "grapevines" they understood the image and what He was talking about: planting; growing; pruning; fruit-bearing. For many of us, Marvin Gaye's 1968 hit, "I Heard it Through the Grapevine," is about as close as we come to knowing much about grapevines – and that had more to do with gossip than grapes. Sadly, "gossip" is something we do know about!

In the Third Letter of St. John, the Apostle writes to his friend Gaius about a man named Diotrephes and his evil behavior:

"I wrote to the church, but Diotrephes, who loves to be first, will have nothing to do with us. So if I come, I will call attention to what he is doing, gossiping maliciously about us. Not satisfied with that, he refuses to welcome the brothers. He also stops those who want to do so and puts them out of the church. Dear friend, do not imitate what is evil but what is good. Anyone who does what is good is from God. Anyone who does what is evil has not seen God." (3 John 9-11)

Among other sinful behaviors, Diotrephes was engaged in gossiping and speaking maliciously about John and other church leaders. John makes it clear that such behavior is evil and not pleasing to God. He says that "anyone who does what is evil has not seen God."

Unfortunately we see this kind of malicious behavior all around us in politics, the work place and even in churches. Of course it's nothing new as we see in John's epistle. The Bible clearly directs us to restrain our speech and control our tongue. Those who transmit and spread gossip have malicious intentions as much as the people who start the gossip in the first place. That "grapevine" leads to destruction and harms people and their reputations. God Himself addresses this particular sin in the Eighth Commandment: "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor."

I recently came across an article on gossip that I found helpful. Gossip, it said, has three breeds, or three different levels. Separating these three levels can be as hard as separating the chocolate chips out of a cookie. It is extremely hard to do without disturbing the cookie! So it is with our mislaid words.

First: The "chit chat" we all do. "Did you hear that the Smith's are moving" or "Joe's parents gave him a new car for his birthday." This is basic information without harmful intent, but we must be careful what we say and how we say it! We may even convey what seems to be a harmless truth/fact, but express it in a way that is not helpful. Often time this may not really qualify as gossip.

Second: Gets stickier. "Did you hear that Billy's parents are fighting again" or "Have you heard that Joe is in a real bad mood, so just ignore him." This may not be mean or vindictive, but this tells a story of someone's character that may not be true. And we will base our judgments on this misleading information.

Third: Slander! Maliciously telling or repeating a tale that may or may not be true and may tear someone down – intentionally or unintentionally. "Do not go near Susie, she is weird and nobody likes her" or "The new family is only here because the father was fired from his job and they had to move." This third level of gossip destroys people's reputations and betrays secrets that are not meant for our ears. This level destroys relationships and takes potentially good relations and harms them, doing exactly what Satan wants!

This would be a great thing to give up for Lent! Actually, for good! Let us be careful about what we say and how we say it (or tweet, email...). Let us rather strive to encourage and build one another up. When we are tempted to say something about someone else, tell it to the Lord in prayer. When we have an issue with someone, go directly to them instead of to another person. In his explanation to the Eighth Commandment Martin Luther writes: "defend your neighbor, speak well of him, and put the best construction on everything." (Luther's Small Catechism)

"A man of knowledge uses words with restraint, and a man of understanding is even-tempered. Even a fool is thought wise if he keeps silent, and discerning if he holds his tongue, without wood a fire goes out; without gossip a quarrel dies down." (Proverbs 17:27-28; 26:20)
