From Gethsemane To Golgotha To The Empty Garden Tomb

(Continued from last month)

Then Jesus rises from prayer in Gethsemane and awakens his disciples to face his destiny. "Rise! Let us go! Here comes my betrayer!" Jesus' prayer in Gethsemane is explained by his lonely cry at Golgotha: "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" recalling the beginning words of Psalm 22, an amazing psalm that prefigures many of the events of the cross.

Jesus' final words from the cross, however, are words of hope. The sixth word is: "It is finished." We have done it, Father, at huge cost to both you and me. It is finished. The ransom is paid, the stain of sin is borne away from the people we love. It is finished.

His seventh and last word also looks forward in hope, in faith: "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." The Father's hands are strong enough to hold both him and us, even in our most devastating moments, even when we don't feel his presence at all.

Saturday is quiet; it is Sabbath in Jerusalem. But Sunday morning, all heaven breaks loose, and the Son of God steps out of the grave. His body that has born our sin is recognizable by the scars, but the stench of sin and death are gone. He is risen! Hallelujah! And his resurrection is our confidence that God has both accepted his sacrifice for sin, and flooded us with his healing, life-giving power. Hallelujah!

Long before you ever needed a Savior, your Father so loved you -- and "the world" and "the many" -- so that he sent his own Son to bear your sins, so that you no longer have to bear them. He was laid in the tomb bearing your sins. But on Easter Sunday his body was changed and set free and victorious. And so are you in his loving hands. That is grace -- God's unmerited favor for us who are so loved by him.

That is the message of Gethsemane and Golgotha and the Empty Garden Tomb. Hallelujah! He is risen!

MITES


MITES (spare change) is always being collected for LWML. Donations (clearly marked "MITES") can be placed in Linda Meissner's mailbox in the church coatroom.

"We're Kidding Ourselves"

This past week a friend of mine forwarded to me a video recording of Kentucky Governor Matt Bevin's response to a question regarding a comment he made about school violence. Essentially, he says the multiple shootings at schools, churches, and other public places is a cultural problem and that we are kidding ourselves if we think it can be solved by a single law or regulation.

Gov. Bevin talks about the cultural shift in America in recent decades, mostly the reality that we're "... desensitized to the value and dignity of human life." He identifies rampant pornography, abortion, and disrespect for women as causal factors. He also mentions violent video games, where you get points for kill counts and you slaughter people.

"We're desensitizing people to the value of life. We see it through the lyrics of music, television shows, and movies, through the fact that the mores of this country have changed, and the fact that we increasingly want to remove any sense of moral authority from everything."

"In a nation where over the last 40 years we've aborted 50+ million children and where we have multiple states with medically assisted suicide being provided by doctors, at both ends of the life spectrum we're losing the value for life that we once historically had."

"Young people are increasingly becoming more suicidal and depressed because of the use of social media. All this is part of the cultural issue, why homes are broken. We need people in positions of influence to step up and call people to a higher moral authority."

"Shame on us if we don't sound the alarm! ... You want to change the mores of a nation, remove any sense of higher responsibility, and assume the government and a piece of regulation or a rule is a solution. And then we're shocked when these things (school shootings) happen! We're kidding ourselves!"

- #8 Even duct tape can't fix stupid, but it sure does muffle the sound.
- #9 Lately, I've noticed people my age are so much older than me.
- #10 When I was a child, I thought nap time was punishment. Now it's a mini vacation.
- *#11 I thought growing old would take longer.*
- #12 Wouldn't it be wonderful if we could put ourselves in the dryer for ten minutes, then come out wrinkle-free and three sizes smaller?

Some of those observations are accurate. Others are gross exaggerations!

One not mentioned above is that sometimes we procrastinate on responsibilities that need attention. I have discovered that folks of all ages, including men and women my age or better, keep postponing preparation of important legal and practical documents that need to be taken care of. I'm thinking especially of a Last Will and Testament. Also important are powers of attorney for finances and health care; a list of assets, liabilities, account numbers, and passwords; information and plans for our funeral service.

Some folks put off taking care of these things because they simply don't want to admit that one day those documents will really come in handy for a surviving spouse and family. Or they just don't want to think about the reality of death. Here's the truth: Death happens! The Lutheran Church Foundation can assist you with these wise preparations.
