“GROWING AND BEARING FRUIT”

“I am the true Vine, and my Father is the gardener. Remain in Me, as I remain in you. I am the Vine; you are the branches. If you remain in Me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from Me you can do nothing.”
John 15:1,4a & 5

“April showers bring May flowers.” I hope the same thing can be said of April snow and ice after this past month! Actually, in spite of the recent unseasonably cold weather, many plants and flowers are starting to push up out of the ground. What a welcome sight to see! Spring and summer (soon) may actually be arriving. This past week I have heard several people saying things like: “it can’t come soon enough”; “...so much for ‘global warming’”; and, “I can’t wait to get out in the yard and garden.” Spring is full of things like budding, growing, and planting. It is an affirmation of life once again after a long cold winter!

Similarly, our lives as redeemed and living disciples of Jesus are about renewal, growing and bearing fruit. John records Jesus’ words comparing us to branches. As we are supported and nurtured by and through the Vine, we are to bring forth fruit – “much fruit!” Christian discipleship, that is following Jesus demands and requires fruitfulness. And, the only way to bring forth much fruit is by remaining connected to the Vine, Jesus Christ! Apart from Jesus we can do nothing. We can’t bear fruit. We can’t even be saved! In fact, the eternal consequence of being apart from Jesus is just that – eternal and unalterable separation from Jesus and eternal life!

Many of you know how to grow flowers, vegetables and fruit. It takes a plan of watering, weeding, cultivating, and in West Seneca – defending against the deer. How do you remain connected to the Lord and bear the fruits of faith? It takes a plan of action too.

- Remaining in “Me,” Jesus – the “Word” of God. The growing disciple must be in God’s Word regularly, routinely, daily! There is really no other way. Jesus said, “apart from Me you can do nothing.” A daily Bible reading plan is helpful. Attending a Bible Class or Small Group can be very helpful as well. Studying God’s Holy Word yourself is very valuable and essential. Yes, even memorization of Bible verses can be quite powerful.
- Remain in the “Body of Christ,” the church! Gather with other believers in Jesus and build one another up in the faith. This is the design of the Gardener. The branches, connected to the Vine (Jesus) can support and encourage and bear one another up. When the heavy snows and ice of testing and temptation weigh heavily, the branches can support one another. That’s the blessing of being called together and working as God’s church.
- Bear fruit! Get involved in the mission and ministry of the church. Consider your likes and dislikes, your talents and abilities, as well as the opportunities that come your way. God works in these and many other ways to lead us in bringing forth the fruits He would have us bear. Jesus calls all who would follow Him to love and serve as He did. What an exciting calling it is!
- Remain in communication with the Vine: PRAY! Talk to the Lord regularly and often. It need not be in well polished and crafted prayers. Speak to Jesus from your heart. His heart is always open and listening. There are many resources available to help one in his/her prayer life. The Book of Psalms in the Old Testament can be a great help. Even one of our hymnals can be a wonderful help. Often times, hymns are prayers set to music.

As the sun grows warmer and the days a little longer, the earth wakes up once again and begins to bring forth the flowers, fruits and vegetation the eternal Gardener planted in the days of creation. As the Son warms and nurtures us, let us grow, blossom and flourish in the fruits of faith! In the day of the harvest we will rejoice in the Lord together!

When people have a resolve, intent or will to achieve a goal, you would think that, what follows is a plan and a path to accomplish the matter.

However, people have different ways to realize their aims or objectives. Some are aggressive in decision-making as initiative takers, driven to complete the various tasks of life. Others are more passive and many avoid doing what they know is important, or would prefer to complete.

Research shows us that 30-70% fail to plan for the inevitable, material implications associated with end of life. Whether with a last will and testament, trust, or specific asset titles/designations, typically, less than half of free citizens have managed the financial and relational risks associated with death.

Reasons seem understandable. Death isn’t fun to think about. After all, no one plans to die today! ‘We’d rather not do today, what we can put off until tomorrow.’ Besides, such decision planning takes more energy to cross this higher emotional threshold than some are willing to invest. Others aren’t aware of the implications of the ‘one-size-fits-all’ plan that the State has waiting them if they don’t.

Perhaps a will isn’t planned because the intent of a person’s heart isn’t clear? Fear and concern for self can keep one from knowing and planning the way of the baptized heart.

The biblical call to vocation for Christian stewards gives two imperatives: First, we are called to love God as life’s priority. Then, our calling is to love others as ourselves; the second priority. For most, these spiritual priorities completely break down at death.

Don’t fail to plan. Consider aligning your will to the priorities of God’s Word, so these values endure. What a blessing that our God has given us infinite kindness in our perfect Savior!

We would like to thank everyone who volunteered their time and energy in making the 1st annual Vendor/Craft/Rummage Sale a huge success. We were able to raise \$2,018 to help with our initiative to involve members from the school and the church, youth and adults alike, to work together doing the Lord's work locally and domestically.

We understand that not everyone is ready to travel to a country like Haiti for various reasons; some of these may include cost, distance, language barrier and possible health risks. We also understand that many of our church and school family members would love to share their faith through servant-hood projects closer to home.

We have heard back from SCORE International and they have an opportunity for us to serve in the Syracuse area. The date for this mission trip is Monday, July 16 –Wednesday, July 18. The trip would include serving food to the needy, a building work project and some evangelism work.

We would also like to extend an invitation to you and your family to join us in this endeavor to do God's work in the Syracuse area this summer. The age limit for this trip is 12 years of age and up. **Please contact us by Tuesday, May 1 if you are interested.** **Tentative cost:** \$80 person/night includes lodging, breakfast, lunch and dinner meal, ministry/work project set up, and SCORE representative on the ground.

Team's responsibilities: special ministry supplies if needed, extra \$10/person/day for work project, all ground transportation, and souvenir/recreational expenses.

Some of the cost of the trip may be offset by fundraisers (vendor/craft/rummage sale). Prayerfully consider this mission opportunity.

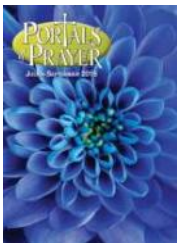

Book Review:

Joining Jesus on His Mission: How to be an Everyday Missionary

By Greg Finke / Published by Tenthpower Publishing

“How is Jesus messing with you?” Have you ever been asked that question? And what does it mean?

Greg Finke captures your attention and builds on how we followers of Jesus can join Him in His mission here on earth. He has been active from the time of His ascension, when He told us to “Go and make disciples, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit”. Greg discusses what it means to be in His kingdom, and how when we join Jesus in His mission, we let Him do the hard work. We are to simply enjoy our fellow sinners, seek out Jesus in His mission in their lives and respond.

Greg even makes it easy for those who would rather skim through the How-to’s. At the end of each chapter he has a quick summary of what he has discussed. You’ll glean more by reading the whole chapter, but for a quick review, it works. You’d be surprised at the kind of assignment Jesus may have you participate in. How about go to a block party and eat good food and get to know the neighbors for a starter?

Have you ever wondered where the Kingdom of God is? Greg discusses that in Chapter 8, and what it looks like in Chapter 9. In Chapter 10, Greg gives us a list of five mission practices. They are very practical, easy and we are probably doing them in our lives already. We need only to refocus our practices and join Jesus where He is working in the lives of those around us.

Jesus taught His disciples, and then sent them out on mission trips, right? Well that’s the next step Greg discusses. Using quotes from unusual sources, he pulls us in so we begin to understand what it means to see Jesus in the lives of others and how to come along side to respond to their needs.

But if all this is a little scary, don’t worry, Greg addresses that too in Chapter 19. Jesus never leaves us alone; we have fellow missionaries with whom to share experiences. Greg shares a practical agenda for sharing and encouragement, so Jesus’ missionaries don’t get burned out. After all, Jesus is the One who does the saving. His missionaries merely come along side and direct the “pre-Christian” toward the Gospel message.

Greg ends the book with an encouraging benediction, and a couple of Appendices including a discussion guide and FAQ’s. This is an enjoyable, quick read you will want to make time for.

Cemetery News . . .

Burial plots are still available in our cemetery. The cost is:

- Members - \$700 per plot with a \$100 discount per plot when purchasing 2 or more at the same time
- Non-members - \$1,400 per plot (no discounts given). Non-members must be relatives of a Trinity member to purchase plots in our Cemetery

ANY burials or spreading of ashes in Trinity's Cemetery are prohibited without pre-approval from the Cemetery Board. Both state and cemetery regulations need to be adhered to.
