It may seem like a strange title for an article in the July "Trinity Tidings," I suppose. It's not one of those 'Christmas in July' attempts, I assure you. Actually it is a reflection on a couple of responses from recent visitors to our worship services recently. Ironically, both of them were from Lutheran pastors. This past week we were visited by a Canadian pastor and his wife, and several months ago a local pastor joined us for worship. Both of them remarked at the enthusiasm and excitement they experienced before, during and after the worship service. They especially noted the joyful presence of so many children and younger families. They also made it a point to compliment the wonderful music and service projection on the screen.

Brothers and sisters of Trinity, we are truly blessed as a church. Our weekly attendance is up a little, approaching 200 many weeks (not quite the average yet). Our school enrollment was up to 100 this past year. The school passed its accreditation review with flying colors and has been recognized as one of the highest quality programs in the Buffalo area. As a congregation that supports a Pre-K thru 8th grade school we are meeting our budget! Beyond that we have grown in our mission mindedness and support in the West Seneca community, Pioneer Camp and Retreat Center, Southtowns Care Center, the Upper Room Orphanage and School, Buffalo City Mission and other new mission trips. We've been good stewards of our Trinity campus in repairing and upgrading the church stained glass windows, the leaking basement wall, the school restrooms, enhancing the church cemetery, and technology upgrades in the school and church. New programs have been added and are making good strides: the Children's Church program; Stephen Ministry; a variety of studies sponsored by our Women's Ministry and the Men in Ministry. Our website has been revamped and is increasing in the number of 'hits' it's receiving. Our Youth Ministry has received new attention and is growing. And our music program is outstanding! That's the comment I have heard from a number of visitors. Our Praise Teams each have their own character and style, but are of high quality and do a great job! The adult choir is down in numbers, a sign of the times I suspect, but still sounds great. The bell choir is a real gem that we are so blessed to enjoy. As we head into the summer months, we are also blessed to worship outdoors on Saturday evenings. And, Trinity is blessed with many quiet yet dedicated volunteers behind the scenes offering all kinds of service to the Lord in the ministry of His church.

We at Trinity are truly blessed, everyone! Let us give thanks to God – to Him be all the glory! Let us also dedicate ourselves in the Lord's service to preserve the joy and harmony of our mission and ministry together in Jesus' name!

Cemetery News

With summer upon us, it is important to be reminded of some of the Rules & Regulations of Trinity's Cemetery:

- <u>ANY</u> burials or spreading of ashes in Trinity's Cemetery are prohibited without pre-approval from the Cemetery Board. Both state and cemetery regulations need to be adhered to.
- Flowers and plants should be placed in rugged, sturdy containers which can be placed on either side of the monuments. They should not be planted directly in the ground. <u>NO</u> glass containers are allowed in the cemetery.
- In-ground plantings (trees, shrubs, etc.) are subject to Cemetery Board approval. Approval must be given <u>prior</u> to anything being planted.
- American flags placed in the cemetery for Memorial Day will be removed after July 4th.

Burial plots are still available in our cemetery.

- Members \$700 per plot with a \$100 discount per plot when purchasing 2 or more at the same time.
- Non-members \$1,400 per plot (no discounts given). Non-members must be relatives of a Trinity member in order to purchase plots.

Trinity School News

From the Principal ...

The end of the school year is such a bittersweet time! We say farewell and God's blessings to our graduates, knowing that we have prepared them for adventures outside of these walls and equipped them to live lives of love in Christ. Some Preschool and other students will not return for various reasons, and it's sad to say goodbye to them as well. The excitement of the end-of-the-year events has worn off, and we are left with an empty building in need of some fresh paint and organizing! I'm happy to be a (small) part of VBS and to know that, at least for a week, the halls will be full of life during the summer.

It's discouraging for me, as the Eastern District Education Executive, to see Lutheran schools and preschools closing almost yearly. As I shared with the delegates and pastors at the recent Eastern District Convention, there are only 24 Lutheran elementary schools left in the 4 northeastern districts of Eastern, Atlantic, New England and New Jersey, of the 2000+ schools nationally! The value of our own school increases dramatically each year as our society, especially in this region, pulls further and further away from the absolute truth of the Bible and the saving message of the Gospel.

Our preschool, for the first time ever, is full! God is so good! We have two classes that are full to capacity, and two excellent teachers to guide the little ones in faith. We are going to need a part-time aide at least 3 mornings per week to work with Mrs Schmidt and her students here in the church basement, so if you are interested or know of someone who may be, please contact myself or Dave Sirgey as soon as possible. Thank you!

It is extremely rewarding to receive such high rankings from Business First and it speaks to the quality of your staff. The rankings are based on 4 years of New York State test scores, which we administer only in 7th and 8th grades. The hard work of Mrs. Willert and Miss Hoffmann, together with the staff, continues to prepare our students both academically and faithfully for their futures. Our mission and purpose were validated by the findings of our NLSA Visitation Team in April - those were our strongest areas - so God is continuing to shower down His blessings on our church and school in many ways. Even financially, by reaching our Annual Fund goal, we'll be able to make improvements to your school building that would not be possible otherwise. This year's project is to remove the classroom carpeting that was installed over 15 years ago and replace it with new flooring. We may not be able to afford to do all 3 classrooms and the office at this time, but we'll do as much as we can with the funds that we have. As you can imagine, there is a lot of glue, juice, crayons, pencil shavings and other unnamed detritus embedded in those carpet fibers after all this time, despite our cleaning efforts! Our Annual Fund also supports our School Endowment Fund.

Please prayerfully consider being a part of our program in the fall. We love having folks read to the children, help serve lunch, assist with projects or just be a smiling face in the classrooms. If you feel you'd like to see for yourself your amazing staff in action and feel the power of this school on our students, please let me know. You are welcome! Check out the new yearbooks on the welcome center desk for a glimpse of school life through photos. Please continue to pray for your school and the life-saving work it does among our students, their families and in our community. Through God's grace, and your prayers and support, we will continue to provide a safe and loving Christian education for our children for many years to come!
