"MARCH"

Time sure is 'marching' on! As we begin the third month of 2019, we move into the Lenten Season with Ash Wednesday on March 6th. Some years we might even celebrate Easter in March as we did in 2016, and will again in 2024. Certainly March is still considered to be a rather wintry month for us in Western New York, but the winter of 2018-2019 is almost behind us. Spring officially begins on the 20th, but mother nature doesn't always follow the calendar. Interestingly, the month is so named after the Roman god of war, "Mars." It marked the season of warfare when armies got marching, so to speak, and could resume fighting that was put on hold through the winter. Modern armies and warfare no longer need to take a winter hiatus from marching. Come to think of it, why do they still drill and march at all? Other than for parades it seems like it's unnecessary and has little to do with fighting and warfare.

I ran across a somewhat recent study that explored this very question. Is there really any value today for armies to drill and march? The conclusions drawn suggested that it was still quite valid and useful, even beyond parades and military displays. First, it benefitted the soldiers as they marched in step with one another to function as a coordinated team. Secondly, there was greater confidence and strength in numbers, so to speak, as they marched together. Thirdly, there was a psychological lift in the camaraderie of the unit. Marching together seems to yield much more than walking to some destination in an organized and orderly fashion! (Air Force study, "Walk In Unison, 2014). As I considered this, it struck me that perhaps the church, likened to being army engaged in spiritual warfare, can learn from this.

In the old hymn, "Onward Christian Soldiers" the church is said to be "marching as to war!" The church of God is to move like a "mighty army." Undoubtedly, like the Apostle Paul wrote in his letter to the Ephesians, the church is in a spiritual war against the powerful and evil forces of this dark world. We need to put on the full armor of God and stand firm in the faith! (Ephesians 6:10-20). We need to march together as a coordinated and gifted team in step with our Lord. We must stand firm in the truth of the Word and the faith we have been called into with boldness and confidence as we contend together against sin and evil. And by the camaraderie of the Spirit of God, the saints who have gone before us and one another, we must hold up the banner of truth and march against the enemy.

This March as we march to the cross and the empty tomb on the Lenten road, let us move in step together as the army of God! Let us drill together in Bible study, worship, and participation of the Sacraments. Let us serve the Lord as we serve others – with one another. Let us celebrate that in the living Lord we too move from the winter of death into the spring of resurrection and new life! Let us be intentional, organized and mission-minded. Let us MARCH!

From the Principal ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



These next several weeks before Easter are some of the most intense academic weeks of the school year. Winter break ends, and it's non-stop until Easter. Teachers know their days are numbered in regards to completing the curriculum, and the students are determined to reach that level of mastery that may award them a roll status on their next report card. Mrs. Anderson begins practicing for the spring musical, and families are signing up and selling tickets for the Spaghetti Dinner and Basket Auction on March 23. In the office, we're busy organizing that same event, helping to pull details for the Annual Fund mailing together, making plans to update technology and textbooks, procuring state and federal grants, and all of the other details that keep our school running efficiently, positively and to His glory. It is challenging and fulfilling to work toward such a lofty goal. It may not seem world-changing to some people, but to those students and families whose lives are touched daily by God's Word, it may be life-changing, by His grace!

Our Board of Christian Education has not yet decided on how the Annual Fund will be used this year, but we are in the wonderful position of needing more desks and chairs in the upper grades and more advanced STEM tools for the upper graders, too. It may finally be time to replace our stage - it has certainly served its time and is at the point of being a safety hazard! We continue to improve the safety features of the school, as well. Safety glass in the classroom doors, fire escape windows in the east classrooms and an improved locking system on the front door are all in the works. The 3rd and 4th grade homeroom got its new floor during the February break, thanks to the Annual Fund. Two classroom floors done, one more to go.

The Spaghetti Dinner, which supports tuition, scholarship and budget; and the Annual Fund, which supports facilities improvement and growth, as well as scholarship, are both so important to our school and church. I hope that you will prayerfully consider your participation in both of these opportunities to further the strength of our ministry here at Trinity. Your stewardship, of both time and finances, are what allow the school to thrive and to prepare so many young people for lives of service to Christ. Any support you feel led to provide is truly needed and appreciated. Thank you for your ongoing dedication to your mission vehicle here at Trinity. Praise God that we can serve Him and others in this way, and may He continually bless our efforts in His name!

The whole person on the right shows us that through Jesus and his life, death on the cross and resurrection, broken people are made whole. The circle shows God's eternal and never-ending love for us. If you have driven by the church and school on a Saturday morning/afternoon from December through February, you might have wondered what was going on with all of the cars in the parking lot. For the past several years, Trinity's school gym has been the site of the WNY Christian Basketball League. Every Saturday (outside of a two-week stretch for a Christmas/New Year's break) for three months, 16 teams (over 150 players), coaches and parents come to Trinity for basketball. The league is made up of teams from various churches, Christian and public organizations. This year, the teams were broken up into two divisions – by age group – middle school thru 9th grade and 9th – 12th grade.

For the third year in a row, Trinity Church and School has sponsored a team for the younger division, made up of players from the school's boys' varsity team, Jr. High members from Trinity Lutheran Church and some friends from outside of the church. We also had two members from St. John's Orchard Park join our team this year (their team from previous years disbanded).

The league, organized by Mark Jentsch, has a theme of "One Team, One Priority: Impact Lives." The four main goals of the league are to:

- Witness and introduce people to Jesus and the Christian life,
- Promote fellowship and fun between players,
- Practice and demonstrate Christlikeness in leaders
- Play healthy, fun, competitive basketball.

One of the ways the league accomplishes its goal of Christian outreach is through a half-time devotional between every game. The coaches from each team get assigned a week to write and deliver the message to all of the teams and the fans in the stands. This half-time talk, along with a prayer before every game, has been a great opportunity for both players, parents and other coaches to hear and reflect on God's Word. Each message is then reinforced and talked about during team practices throughout the week.

After finishing the 2018 season winning the C-League Championship, this year's 2018-2019 Trinity team's season ended in the playoff semi-finals – losing to the eventual champion, West Seneca Christian. We are all already looking forward to next season, as most of our players will be returning to the team. There is even a good chance we might be able to support a team in the older division next year.
