"GOD IS GOOD ALL THE TIME ..."

Is God "really good" and what does that actually mean? Our Summer Bible Camp / Vacation Bible School theme is based on the premise: "God is Good – in all circumstances!" I went to Scripture and spent some time doing a word study on "good". Let's just say, the Bible has a lot of "good" in it! Interestingly, the Bible never explicitly and literally says, "God is good." And, Luther's Small Catechism does not list "good" among the attributes of God (holy, fair, faithful, 'benevolent' (good?), merciful, gracious and loving).

The first thing I noticed was that God is the ultimate judge of <u>what is good</u>. He was the first one to declare something as good when, in Genesis 1, He called creation into being. He saw that it was good \ldots very good! Before we can label a person or situation good, we have to look to God. And if that's the case, then we need to look at what God's definition of good is. I'm sure it encompasses many things.

Good is something or someone being perfect. Now before you think you've already lost that battle, let's unpack the statement. When "perfect" is used in the Bible, it doesn't mean "without flaws". It actually means "complete." Something is perfect when it's finished and whole. Again, look at creation. God declared that each piece of creation was good when it was completed.

Good also means in abundance. The Bible often uses good as an adjective that could be translated to "a lot of" or "very." Look at Joshua 1. God did not just implore this young soldier to be strong but to be of "good courage" (Joshua 1:9). A good thing should be showing no signs of lack, and that overflow is for our betterment. That's why God said that it wasn't good that Adam was alone in the Garden (Genesis 2:18). He was in lack, so God gave him Eve. That's what good does. It gives us more of what we need to stay in tune with God and to do His will.

Good is morally right. David lamented the evil people of his day saying that "there is none that doeth good, no, not one" (Psalm 14:3). Yet, he goes on to say in chapter 25, "Good and upright is the LORD: therefore will he teach sinners in the way" (Psalm 25:8). We know that good is the opposite of evil, and doing good is a choice we have to make. God gives us that ability to do the right thing as the ultimate source of what is good.

So is God really good? Well, let's rethink the question. First and foremost, let's take it out of the context of getting *our wishes granted*. It is always wonderful when our prayers are answered; however, His goodness doesn't start and end there.

Is God abundant? Absolutely. He cannot be held within the bounds of space and time. He owns the cattle on a thousand hills (Psalm 50:10). His love is infinite, and His mercy endures forever. He is and always will be more than we need.

Is He perfect? Yes, He needs nothing else to be God. He is complete in and of Himself.

Is He morally right? Of course. God literally wrote the book on morality.

So the answer is **YES!** Despite our ups and downs – whether we are rejoicing on the mountaintop or wallowing in the valley – He is good. And His goodness is a foundation solid enough to build our faith upon.

Are you familiar with the song "Dream Small" by Josh Wilson? It's been on the radio for some months now. As a continuation of my thoughts on trust from last month, and how it pertains to our church /school ministry partnership, this song strikes a note-worthy chord. (ha!)

We have all heard the saying "go big or go home", right? If you're going to do something, do it right, make an impression, don't do it halfway. All practical advice, if used correctly. 




Prayer Is More Powerful

Cemetery News

With summer upon us, it is important to be reminded of some of the Rules & Regulations of Trinity's Cemetery:

- <u>ANY</u> burials or spreading of ashes in Trinity's Cemetery are prohibited without pre-approval from the Cemetery Board. Both state and cemetery regulations need to be adhered to.
- Flowers and plants should be placed in rugged, sturdy containers which can be placed on either side of the monuments. They should not be planted directly in the ground. <u>NO</u> glass containers are allowed in the cemetery.
- In-ground plantings (trees, shrubs, etc.) are subject to Cemetery Board approval. Approval must be given <u>prior</u> to anything being planted.

Burial plots are still available in our cemetery.

- Members \$700 per plot with a \$100 discount per plot when purchasing 2 or more at the same time.
- Non-members \$1,400 per plot (no discounts given). Non-members must be relatives of a Trinity member in order to purchase plots.

LWML Supporters

You can be a passive, yet valuable LWML supporter by donating **Mites**, collecting cancelled **first class stamps** from envelopes (there must be at least ¹/₄ inch border around the stamp), or donating **used electronic equipment or empty brand name ink cartridges**. Stamps and Mites can be put in Linda Meissner's mailbox in the church coatroom. Mite boxes for collecting your extra change can also be picked up from her mailbox. Checks can be made out to Buffalo Zone LWML. Used phones, cameras, tablets, cartridges, etc. can be put into the purple bin in the narthex. All data from used equipment is wiped clean by the recycling company. Donations are redeemed for money and used toward district and national mission projects voted on at the LWML conventions.
