From the LCMS Convention . . .

I share with you quite alarming news regarding the diminishing number of pastors in the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod which may significantly affect the future of Trinity. Currently, half of the ordained pastors serving in the LCMS are over 55 years old (including yours truly). The current enrollment trends suggest that the active pastor population could decrease from the current 6,000 to 3,000 active pastors over the next decade or so. This means that it will become increasingly difficult to call a pastor in the near future. With that in mind, I'm going to discuss this matter with Trinity leadership to explore what we might do to prepare for this challenging situation.
