### A CHRISTMAS VISION!

How do you envision Christmas this year? A beautiful Christmas tree glowing with lights and ornaments? Colorfully wrapped Christmas presents stacked under the tree? The Advent wreathe, candles and Christmas tree glowing in the front of the church at Trinity? Singing the beloved Christmas carols by candlelight at the Christmas Eve service? Family, children and grand children gathered together laughing and enjoying celebrating together? A dining table laden with all the special holiday treats, decorations and yuletide favorites? Perhaps all of these mixed together in a 'Norman Rockwell / Currier & Ives' collage of the perfect Christmas?

We have been talking about "visioning" at Trinity Lutheran Church and School lately as well as preparing for a vision casting process for the congregation in the new year. We are prayerfully going to consider the mission and ministry possibilities and explore where we believe the Lord is leading us. A vital step to this process is envisioning what Trinity might look like in three to five years. Think of it as "Vision -2025!" ### **Blessed With Bells**

Trinity has been immensely blessed with the variety of musical gifts God has placed within the congregation over the years. Hand bells have been a long enjoyed tradition and part of our worship. Their shiny color, beautiful mesmerizing sound and varying techniques used to play them draws the undivided attention of listeners and offers a unique praise to God.

While I have neat memories of my grade school years at Martin Luther and learning to play them, a few months back I walked into church and saw Mary Havens cleaning, tending to, and repairing the bells. After talking to her for a bit, it got me wondering more about the bells and I will feature her sharings in the next newsletter. I happened to stop by again when they were practicing and snapped a few pictures. So for this one, I thought it would be great to start with the conductor, Ellen Makey. Below is her response to some questions I asked. It should also be noted that Ellen is the director for the Trinity choir and also co-leads one of our four worship teams. Thank you Ellen for sharing your gift in music! You are a blessing.

"Music has always been a part of my life. I came from a musical family where singing, instruments, and lessons were always present and encouraged. Whenever an opportunity came along to be a part of something musical - at school, church, in the community - I was there! Playing hand bells was a natural part of those musical opportunities. The first time I played hand bells or had any real knowledge of them was at Concordia College, Bronxville, as a student. I played for one piece as part of a small group that accompanied a Tour Choir selection. It was fun, and a great first experience!

Some years later I played with the hand bell choir at Trinity, Wyandotte, while Brian and I served at that church in Michigan. I started playing hand bells on a regular basis with the choir here at Trinity, West Seneca, a few years after becoming a part of Trinity's community - about 18 years ago.

I enjoy making music with others for the glory of God. Music is, for me, the ultimate expression of praise for all that God has done, and continues to do, in our lives. There are so many ways to make music and yet all can be heartfelt, joyous worship. My hope has always been, that in directing, working with or teaching any group or individual, that each one will learn, not only about the instrument (or voice) and the music, but also about what it means to use their talents for the glory of God.

I have worked under many directors, choral and instrumental. There is always something to be learned - either what works and is helpful or what doesn't work and what isn't very helpful! Hopefully, through prayer and planning, I try to be helpful. :) My most influential directors were those that helped me to understand something about the music that I play (or sing). The purpose and message of music for worship are what set it apart from all other music - music for God's glory and the lifting up of the worshiper."

Ellen also shared a favorite quote: "How good it is to celebrate God's presence and to sing His praises throughout each day! We call all men and women to praise the Lord: those who preach to proclaim His love; those who sing to glorify His name; those who can shout or whistle or write or paint or dance or play musical instruments or pound on drums or ring bells to join in celebrating the majesty of our great and loving God." (Psalms 147-150, Psalms/Now by Leslie F. Brandt)




