"LENT IS IN THE AIR!"

A Blessed Lenten Season to all! That may sound a little strange, I suppose, almost like "Merry Christmas" at Christmas time. Lent is often considered to be a somber time of self-denial, contrition and confession. And, actually, it is! But it is also a time of forgiveness, prayer preparation and growth! It is a significant time of the church year as we prepare for Easter and the events of Holy Week leading up to the victorious resurrection.

The entire month of March falls in the Lenten Season. It began on Ash Wednesday, February 26th and continues through Holy Week until the festival of Easter. It is a 40-day period of prayer, devotion and self-denial in preparation for the glory of the cross and the empty tomb. (Note: The Sundays in Lent are not counted for they are considered to be "mini-Easters".) Historically, fasting was a significant part of the Lenten discipline. While most wouldn't even consider a 40-day fast, the tradition continues as people may give up something like meat, sweets, coffee or television. It was thought that evil spirits used food as a means of entering the body. Fasting then limited the possibility of the Christian contracting an evil spirit. That may sound rather medieval and strange to us today, but consider the evil influences of television, the internet or other media and entertainment. Fasting from such activities may not be so absurd.

The word Lent comes from an Old English word meaning to lengthen. When applied to the season of the year it means "spring" when the days get longer. I have heard Lent referred to as "spring training" for the Christian as we review such teachings as repentance, forgiveness, faith, devotion, and holy living. Some Lutheran Churches may review *Luther's Small Catechism* through the Lenten season. We had done that at Trinity from time to time. Special mid-week Lenten services are offered by many churches that may journey through a special theme. This year Trinity members are being urged to attend the Wednesday morning school chapel services at 9:25 a.m. in the church, or the West Seneca Community of Churches services on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 p.m. There are posters in the fellowship narthex area displaying the schedule and locations of the community services in West Seneca. Trinity Lutheran Church is hosting the service on March 11th at 7:00 p.m. (Pre-Service music starting at 6:50 p.m.).

May our Lord richly bless you in this penitential Lenten season! Through additional Scripture and devotional reading, gathering for mid-week worship, prayer and perhaps some sort of self-denial or fasting, may you be nurtured and blessed as you reflect upon the suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

From the Principal ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Mission,



I had an opportunity to visit a wonderful little preschool in our Eastern District during winter break week in February. Kind and patient teachers, a dedicated director and a caring Board of Education were all part of the big picture, but the most important thing was missing. Jesus was not a presence in the classroom. The children were not hearing His name, Bible verses, prayers or learning Christian habits. This was not at all intentional, but the school's Christian identity had been slowly lost as changes to staff and programming occurred through the years. The Board of Education had asked me to visit, as the local school district was starting a UPK program and they were concerned they would lose students. They were rightly concerned! Without Jesus, what's to differentiate the two programs? Perhaps the church school could offer smaller class sizes, or a beautiful facility, but isn't hearing the Gospel every day the very essence and purpose of our schools? We are committed to teaching our students what it means to live and lead as a Christian. This preschool will, with the help of the congregation and Board, soon be implementing an extensive Christian component in its classrooms, thanks be to God. Their students will know what it means to live each day with the joy of Jesus in their hearts. I returned to Trinity after that break with joy in MY heart knowing that our teachers love their Savior so much that they cannot help but share the life-saving Word with every student, every day. God's Word defines Trinity's history and will shape its future. Thanks be to God!

Our chocolate fundraisers have come to a close (thank goodness.) We still have boxes of stuffed pretzels available for \$10 over at the school, and those funds will still go toward the 7/8 grades class trip. Easter chocolate sales fund all of our school PR, and that sale is closed for this year already, too! THANK YOU to all who supported these efforts. It really makes a difference. Our fourth Annual Fund drive is underway now, with a goal of \$20,000, based on a \$10,000 matching grant. School, parking lot and playground safety will be included in this year's drive, as well as scholarship and other capital improvements.

Our second trimester comes to a close this month! This year's new trimester system is working very well. We've also implemented online enrollment, and after a few preliminary glitches, it is up and running. Enrollment for 2020-21 is well underway! God willing, our staff and our programming, including our new brass and woodwind instrumental program, will continue intact for next year. Our loving Father continues to pour out His blessings upon His faithful servants here at Trinity.

I'm excited to be working with Pastor to provide Baptismal Awareness information for our preschool and Kindergarten parents. For many of them, Baptism is an unknown practice. Please pray that through this targeted action the Holy Spirit will lead them to a thirst for His Word of salvation and for cleansing through Baptism. Also, I will be leading a new one hour Bible study for women on Friday mornings, twice a month or so, on reading and studying the Bible with hearts and minds, and how it equips us to live a transformative life. Please watch the bulletin for dates and times. Our first meeting was 2/28 at 9am, and we'll be meeting again on 3/13 at the same time. All are welcome!

"Case For A Creator"

Case for a Creator for Kids is a book written by Lee Strobel that discusses the beginning of the universe. This book uses many examples of how science points to God, and the fact that God is the creator. Cosmology, physics, and DNA are the tools the author uses in the book that point to God. Cosmology is the study of how the universe was formed, physics tells how things in the world work, and DNA is basically the instruction manual for building proteins which make up the cells of all living things.

The anthropic principle and irreducible complexity are scientific arguments that strongly point to God. The anthropic principle is the idea that the universe was created in exactly the right way to let human beings survive. This points to God because it says that in every direction, some huge coincidence would be needed for all the conditions to have just the right settings. Therefore, there needed to be a creator. For example, if the strength of gravity was represented on a tape measure that spread all the way across the universe, it needed to be marked in exactly the right spot for it to support life. If it was an inch off, gravity wouldn't support life. Irreducible complexity is the simplest possible arrangement of a machine for doing a job. One example of irreducible complexity is a mousetrap, which isn't very complex. Now think of an eye which has many more parts to it. The optic nerve in the back of the eye has one million tiny stems that need to match up with the one million other tiny stems in a certain part of the brain perfectly, of else the eye won't work. It is impossible for something like that to happen by accident, which is why irreducible complexity points to God.

Science such as this is great for pointing people towards God. However, "science strengthens our faith, but doesn't create it." The Holy Spirit is what creates faith. The Holy Spirit can use science to push people to God, but He's the one that grabs on. This happened to a man named Viggo Olson who believed there was no God. He began researching so that he could prove that science disproved God. Viggo started reading the Bible, but he couldn't find any mistakes so he ended up becoming a Christian. There are many other scientists like Viggo Olsen who believe in God not only because of what they see in microscopes and telescopes, but what they see and experience in relationship.

I learned a lot from this book such as the fact that science always ends up pointing to God. This information is so important because after all, without God there would be no universe. This study strengthened my faith because now I know that not only is there spiritual proof... there's scientific proof! This book is another way we can learn about how amazing God is, and that He loves us so much.

More and More Ungodly

I am not an alarmist and consider myself a very logical guy with a trusted (but not perfect) faith in Jesus. As I take a look at what is going on around us regarding our faith, it is staggering and scary. Out of the 4 Christian institutions that God has used to reach into my life, the grade school closed, high school closed, Camp Pioneer- set to close in Oct. 2020, college- still open but struggling... get the idea? Others closed- 2 Lutheran colleges in the last few years, another camp in NY, many area churches (Lutheran and others) in my lifetime with so many hanging in the balance, and a countless number of grammar and high schools (one my daughter attended) in the Buffalo area. As I write this it really hits home. Logic tells me where we are heading. We are becoming the remnant. We have to stop and take a serious look as this all continues to increase at alarming rates.

We can no longer just exist, figuring folks in our society will come to church or Jesus on their own. With all the damage within the church and how judgmentally it is viewed, people are running from anything Godly. The statistics reflected in our society are having a serious effect here at Trinity as well. We have only retained a few of the 205 visitors who've come through our doors in the last six months. Granted, many of these people are visiting relatives of members and are school families. More than half of the children and their families we've confirmed since 2014 have become inactive and do not come to church regularly any more. Our attendance continues to decrease. Below is an article and an opportunity for us to not only learn and become aware of what is going on, but also how to respond as a church.

What Can We Do?

If you've not read the above article, please do. There are two webinars we can watch regarding these challenges. The first, "Understanding the Changing Landscape of Faith" is to help us understand where our society is and headed regarding the spiritual trends of our society in the North Eastern US. Barna has done some solid research and this will help us get an excellent view of where we're currently at. The second, "Mobilizing the Church for Mission" will help us know what to do as a church and will give us the specific understanding and know how step-by-step. We're going to get together to watch these webinars at church (or you can watch them at home on your electronic device). Each will last about an hour. Are taxes evil? Jesus said, when questioned about that, "Give to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God, what is God's." Though some taxes are wasted, much support things we really need.
