Christ Has A New Goal Envisioned

Mention the word "change," and you get all kinds of responses from dread to fear and questions: "Why?" This month we celebrate one of the greatest changes in church history as well as the history of the world – The Protestant Reformation! As Lutherans we praise and thank God for this change and those who led it. We sing "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" and we revel in the supremacy of the Word of God over the words of men and traditions, and rightly we should! However, in the midst of our annual celebration, we must admit that while we laud the monumental changes the Reformation brought about, we tenaciously resist change ourselves. Introduce a new song or hymn in worship, or suggest a different time of worship and watch what happens (and you probably ought to duck). And these are insignificant changes when compared to abolishing indulgences and translating the Bible into the language of the people.

We have had no choice but to accept many changes in the past seven months or so due to the threat and spread of the corona virus. Some have resisted like many college students who insist on partying rather than wearing masks and distancing. Do you remember a church that defied the government order to suspend holding public worship services last Spring? Many members ended up contracting the virus and some died, including the pastor as I recall. Many, like myself, have reluctantly complied with the guidelines and accepted the necessary changes. A few have embraced the changes, quarantined, distanced and donned masks. ALL OF US have been affected by these changes. We have yet to see the full impact of all of these changes on our society, including the church. Interestingly enough, studies have been carried out examining the changes brought about by the Black Plague and how it contributed to changes in the Catholic Church and the Reformation!

All of this resistance to change! Change may be difficult, but it is more often necessary and beneficial. I don't like it when a new version of Microsoft Windows comes out and I have to adapt and learn a revised system. But, it brings with it new and improved capabilities. The man who is told he must have heart by-pass surgery and make some changes in his lifestyle may not like it. If he wants to live, he must change. Churches are the same way. They must adapt and change if they want to live and fulfill their mission. The church of 1960 just won't cut it in 2020! Of course I am not talking about theology, doctrine or confession. In the midst of all of this change, Christ Has A New Goal Envisioned! Martin Luther understood this and put his trust in God when he challenged the church to change!

Trinity must embrace a new vision of ministry in light of a constantly changing culture inside and outside of the church. Already the pandemic has forced Trinity to expand worship services online and in our drive way! I doubt this would have happened if COVID-19 had not forced it. More changes are coming in the post-pandemic world and as we search for new pastoral leadership. God bless us with '20-20' vision to see that Christ Has A New Goal Envisioned!

From the Principal ...

Dear Friends in Christ,

At my home congregation, Immanuel in Tonawanda, we're studying Philippians in Bible class. I just love how Paul greets his beloved congregation, with words so exclusive to Christianity and full of the love of Christ: "Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I thank my God every time I remember you." (Ph.1:2-3) The teachers and I are so thankful for your prayers and support as we continue to minister to God's children at the school and preschool. I thank God that, by His grace, our school is safely open and our students are learning and growing in His love each day. Our population allows us to space and divide desks, take daily temperatures, control lunch room spacing and monitor parent pick-up and drop-off, among many other things. The school building and church classrooms are sparkling clean and full of energy! Hours and hours of volunteer time allowed us to provide as safe an environment as we could, and we pray daily that God continues to bless us all with good health. The teachers have modified their curricula to be effective in this different setting while still caring for the social and emotional needs of the students. We were even able to offer advanced Algebra to our eligible 8th graders by putting the currently empty church Youth Room to good use! Your school administration (principal and Board) and staff work very hard to be responsible stewards of the many blessings He has so richly provided.

Thanks so much to the Outreach Team for providing welcome bags for our new school families! It was a pleasure to distribute them to the students and see their eyes light up. It didn't even matter what was in the bags! Our new families, along with the ongoing ones, are being wonderfully responsible about safety, but we're all trying to adjust to school life without the many great fellowship events that are the basis of our program. Next year, God-willing! The staff is affected, too, in many ways. It's very difficult being so isolated from each other each day. Another example - our Eastern District Professional Church Workers Convocation is virtual this year. We'll all be together at the school to participate, but will dearly miss the 2-day fellowship with our co-workers from across the District.

Have you heard of the Buffalo Burrito Project? It is one of several Burrito Project initiatives nationally that provides a hot meal each week to inner-city homeless. With its home base at St. Paul Lutheran in North Tonawanda, volunteers prepare and distribute burritos every Tuesday night on the streets of Buffalo. Local nursing homes had also previously assisted with preparation, but their help is on hold right now, which increases production costs. The school has adopted the Buffalo Burrito Project as its first trimester offerings and dress down dollars recipient. We'll be hearing from the BBP director in a few weeks at an outdoor chapel service. The students will be assembling "snack bags" of pre-packaged treats, and constructing fleece scarf, socks and candy 'burritos' to donate for distribution along with their monetary donations. Our school year theme, "Sent to Serve", based on Matthew 20:28, is the motivation for our donation recipients this year.

We've been enjoying the use of the outdoor stage by the church portico for our chapel services so far this year. We use a small amp from the school for sound and spread the children's chairs out in the parking lot for a safe and effective worship time! It is the only time our entire student body can be in each other's 'distant' presence, and it makes worship that much more meaningful. We're all praying that we continue to be blessed with cooperative weather! Once again, it is such a joy to spend each day with God's children here at Trinity school. Please continue to pray for <u>all</u> of our ministry and missions here at Trinity!

LCMS Foundation Gift Planning


"If I plan my estate or end of life decisions, it means that I accept that I will die, and I don't want to talk about such things."

That was Susan's response to a Gift Planning Counselor of the LCMS Foundation. That counselor pointed her to the words of Jesus in John 11 when He said, "*I am the resurrection and life…whoever lives and believes in me will by no means die, forever*." Their conversation centered around the truth that because of Jesus and His death and resurrection, "*death no longer has mastery over us.*" (Romans 6)

Whether here on earth or with the Lord in heaven, life continues. "For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands. Meanwhile we groan, longing to be clothed instead with our heavenly dwelling, because when we are clothed, we will not be found naked. For while we are in this tent, we groan and are burdened, because we do not wish to be unclothed but to be clothed instead with our heavenly dwelling, so that what is mortal may be swallowed up by life." (2 Corinthians 5)

Having this conversation gave Susan a sense of peace. She put her Lifetime Plan for $\text{Giving}^{\text{TM}}$ together with her LCMS Gift Planning Counselor. She was thankful that this process had final enabled her to get beyond the fear of death and dying that had haunted her throughout her life.
