Do you remember the Game of Scruples? It came out 36 years ago, so many of you may never have heard of it. Basically, the game challenged the players to respond to a variety of challenging dilemmas which would reveal one's scruples, ethics and morality. Real life, which is no game, challenges us daily with many dilemmas for which there are a number of alternative responses. How we respond reveals much about our faith, personality and "scruples." Believe it or not, Martin Luther and the Reformation can help us with these everyday dilemmas!

The Reformers were guided by the conviction that the church of their day had drifted away from the essential, original teachings of Christianity, especially regarding the forgiveness of sins, the grace of God, salvation and the authority of the Word of God. So Martin Luther and the other Reformers sought to re-orient the church and populace on the original and true message of Jesus Christ and the early church. They formulated five basic statements called "Solas" (Latin meaning "alone / only") to summarize the essential theological convictions of Christianity as revealed in God's Holy Word. They are still relevant and very helpful to us today in our walk of faith and responding to life's dilemmas.

- 1. Sola Scriptura (Scripture Alone) God's Word, The Bible, is our highest authority and standard!
- 2. Sola Fide (Faith Alone) We are saved through faith alone in Jesus Christ and not by our works!
- 3. Sola Gratia (Grace Alone) We are saved only by the undeserved love and grace of God!
- 4. Solus Christus (Christ Alone) Jesus Christ alone is our Lord, Savior and King!
- 5. Soli Deo Gloria (To God Alone be all the glory) We live for the glory of God alone!

From the Principal ...

Dear Friends,

Last week, a new third grade student asked a teacher about the rainbow pictures on the wall, and the funny looking boats under the rainbows. The teacher explained that those were students' paintings of the Promise of God to Noah in the Bible story of Noah's Ark. The student said she had never heard that story ... the teacher had the joy of sharing that Bible miracle with her. Events of this kind are not uncommon here! Especially with the influx of new students this year, it has become sadly obvious that we have a lot of Gospel sharing to do. Praise God that He has led those students and their families here, and we pray that the Holy Spirit moves in their hearts as they hear and learn the Word of God through our school.

These next few months are taking on a very different look than they have in the past concerning student body activities. From Reformation, Thanksgiving and Christmas worship experiences to Pumpkin Day, Thanksgiving Feast Day and a visit from Santa, new plans are being made. Our upper grade students are bemoaning the loss of most of their favorite non-academic events, but the staff is being very creative in replacements for the usual routine. It takes a lot of thought and extra planning, but we're determined that the children have a school experience this year that is wonderfully, instead of disappointingly, memorable. Santa may have to share his felicitations from the parking lot with the bull horn, but since he is one more voice pointing the children to Christ at Christmas, he will prevail!!

Last week our students assembled our current mission project gifts - mini care packages for the Buffalo Burrito Project volunteers to distribute to the homeless they serve in Buffalo. The children wrapped fleece scarves around a pair of warm socks and some sweet treats, and a notecard of care and a Gospel message. The Buffalo Burrito Project was also blessed by many blankets assembled by Trinity members. The director was so thankful! The current health situation makes the work of many local volunteer organizations even more challenging. Our support is deeply appreciated. - Non-members \$1,400 per plot (no discounts given). Non-members must be relatives of a Trinity member in order to purchase plots.



With great care, planning, and concern for safety, we were able to hold our Trunk or Treat event again this year. Thanks to the Glinksi Family for your help! By God's grace, we had only 4 spaces left for what we safely had room for and didn't have to send anyone away. We estimated there were about 160 people from the church and school, enjoying the event and at the end hearing God's word in a brief devotion talking about an "ebenezer". The word means, "stone of my help". We see in the Bible after fighting the Philistines, Samuel sets up a stone and says, "This far, the Lord has helped us," to memorialize the success of the battle.

We as families can do the same thing. In the devotion, I shared that our family set up one in the woods of Emery Park. Huddled over the pile of rocks we gathered, praying and thanking God for keeping our girls in Christian education all along the way, as they now both headed off to college. We will occasionally take a hike and visit there, and remember the things God has done.

Inviting the Trunk or Treat attendees to do the same, I must say it was quite a sight as I peeked out while leading a prayer from the middle of the Trinity parking lot, looking at all the family huddles I was surrounded by. The simple desire to gather candy led to an opportunity to focus on God's love and providence.
