Financial Update

Through ten months of our fiscal budget, July 1 to April 30, our bottom line is still in the black: Total Income = \$607,000, Total Expenses = \$595,000. Regular offerings are down about 8% vs. last year. Most of the drop has occurred since November.

Our special ministry accounts remain in good shape. The parsonage windows will be paid off by the end of our fiscal year. Please continue to support the Building the Future Account as this is used to pay a portion of our monthly mortgage payment.

- Host monthly pizza nights


