Cemetery News

With summer upon us, it is important to be reminded of some of the Rules & Regulations of Trinity's Cemetery:

- <u>ANY</u> burials or spreading of ashes in Trinity's Cemetery are prohibited without pre-approval from the Cemetery Board. Both state and cemetery regulations need to be adhered to.
- Flowers and plants should be placed in rugged, sturdy containers which can be placed on either side of the monuments. They should not be planted directly in the ground. <u>NO</u> glass containers are allowed in the cemetery.
- In-ground plantings (trees, shrubs, etc.) are subject to Cemetery Board approval. Approval must be given <u>prior</u> to anything being planted.

Burial plots are still available in our cemetery.

- Members \$700 per plot with a \$100 discount per plot when purchasing 2 or more at the same time.
- Non-members \$1,400 per plot (no discounts given). Non-members must be relatives of a Trinity member in order to purchase plots.

Pioneer Update: Building a Firm Foundation

The great news is that the sale of the grounds of Camp Pioneer is in process and currently in the hands of the State attorney General for approval of being sold to Concordia Lutheran Ministries out of Cabot, PA. However, the camp programming will be run by Friends of Pioneer inc. (FOP) who will lease the land from Concordia. This all has been in the works since the end of last year and has been a great orchestration of God. This way, FOP will begin ministry debt free and any donations will go into facility expansion/ improvement and programming.

With donations already received, FOP has hired 3 part time maintenance workers to begin upkeep and making repairs. While there won't be any programming held there this summer, in 2022 there certainly will be. The plan is to increase programming and operations over 5 years bringing it back to it's full ministry. But for now, it's all about building a "Firm Foundation". Once the property is purchased, soon folks will be invited to help out physically doing cleanup, repairs and improvements.

In the next six months the FOP Board of Directors will go through a visioning process as well as be trained in board governance. Please pray for this process!

If you would like to give and help out, there are a few ways to do that. Once you're at <u>friendsofpioneer.org</u>, you can click the link "Give", or go to the "Wish list" link to donate toward a specific item. Either option will provide an opportunity to make a difference in building our "Firm Foundation". Besides paying the maintenance workers, there is also insurance and many other fees and costs (like the visioning and governance training mentioned above). Right now we are operating purely on donations which God is supplying and we are truly thankful for!
