"Love In Deed"

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, this feels like a tumultuous time of cultural tension and change following the Supreme Court decision on Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Center, and the reversal of Roe v. Wade. For some this has been a greatly sought-after moment for years and years, a preservation of life at its earliest stages. There are certainly others who feel this decision is an imposition on women's rights. And there are probably many others who feel conflicted about the whole issue. As with any other issue, there are many different opinions with people investing a lot of themselves and their emotional energy in the outcomes.

Given these realities, I find myself with two main takeaways for the church at this moment. Firstly, I am reminded of Paul's words in Colossians 4:6 "Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person." Unfortunately, a good deal of the anger I see presented in social media is towards Christians, but there is affair amount of anger displayed by Christians as well. This is an opportunity for us to show the love of Christ in our interactions with others, our speech full of grace.

Secondly, we need to continue to support young families, and young men and women from all backgrounds. Elective abortions continue to remain legal in the state of New York and that doesn't seem like it will change anytime soon. There continues to be men who pressure women in relationships. There continues to be women forced to make difficult decisions. There continues to be families that are in desperate need of support and resources to care for their children. There continues to be prenatal health issues. The work of our care ministry doesn't stop because Roe v. Wade was overturned. The commission remains for us today, "Let us not love in word or talk but in deed and in truth." (1 John 3:18)



Cemetery News

With summer upon us, it is important to be reminded of some of the Rules & Regulations of Trinity's Cemetery:

- <u>ANY</u> burials or spreading of ashes in Trinity's Cemetery are prohibited without pre-approval from the Cemetery Board. Both state and cemetery regulations need to be adhered to.
- Flowers and plants should be placed in rugged, sturdy containers which can be placed on either side of the monuments. They should not be planted directly in the ground. <u>NO</u> glass containers are allowed in the cemetery.
- In-ground plantings (trees, shrubs, etc.) are subject to Cemetery Board approval. Approval must be given <u>prior</u> to anything being planted.

Burial plots are still available in our cemetery.

- Members \$700 per plot with a \$100 discount per plot when purchasing 2 or more at the same time.
- Non-members \$1,400 per plot (no discounts given). Non-members must be relatives of a Trinity member in order to purchase plots.



Rev. John Pingel Elected As Our New LCMS District President

The Rev. John Pingel of West Seneca, NY was elected to his first term as president of the LCMS Eastern District at the district's 100th Convention, held June 17-18 in Tonawanda, NY. He succeeds the Rev. Dr. Chris Wicher on Sept. 1, 2022, who is retiring after serving four terms as district president. Pingel was elected on the second ballot.

Since 2010, Pingel has served as the pastor of Salem Lutheran Church in Buffalo, NY.
