# "God in the Dog Days of Summer"

We've made it to the "dog days of summer," although I don't know if anyone is celebrating. Sure, it could be worse. We have enjoyed warm weather so far this July, and our A/C units may have been working overtime. According to the *Farmers' Almanac*, "The Dog Days of Summer describes the most oppressive period of summer, between July 3rd and August 11th each year." "Some say that [the term] signifies hot sultry days 'not fit for a dog'; others suggest it's the weather in which dogs go mad" (farmersalmanac.com). In actuality, the term "dog days of summer" has to do with the position of the Sun. During this time of year, it is in the same region of the sky as Sirius, the Dog Star, which is part of the constellation *Canis Major*, the Greater Dog.

Admittedly, heat and humidity may be the least of your concerns. Family conflict, financial stressors, a health crisis, and the unrelenting reminders from a guilty conscience can be far more damaging, and ticking the thermostat down a few degrees won't bring the desired relief. The apostle Paul talks of all creation groaning under the effects of sin in this world, and we too cry out for release (Romans 8:22-23).

The good news in these dog days of summer (and all year 'round) is that God hears our pleas and responds with grace and mercy. He is at work in the world undoing the devil's destructive influence. As the message of Jesus Christ, who was crucified and resurrected for you and for all, is preached and taught and as Christians demonstrate the love of Jesus, God reverses the dogged downfall of our lives and this world, and He brings rebirth and renewal. Through our Savior, we have peace that surpasses what our human reason can comprehend (Philippians 4:7), faith that defies what our senses tell us (Hebrews 11:1), and a hope that when all is said and done will not disappoint (Romans 5:3-5).

## **Cemetery News**

With summer upon us, it is important to be reminded of some of the Rules & Regulations of Trinity's Cemetery:

- <u>ANY</u> burials or spreading of ashes in Trinity's Cemetery are prohibited without pre-approval from the Cemetery Board. Both state and cemetery regulations need to be adhered to.
- Flowers and plants should be placed in rugged, sturdy containers which can be placed on either side of the monuments. They should not be planted directly in the ground. <u>NO</u> glass containers are allowed in the cemetery.
- In-ground plantings (trees, shrubs, etc.) are subject to Cemetery Board approval. Approval must be given <u>prior</u> to anything being planted.

Burial plots are still available in our cemetery.

- Members \$700 per plot with a \$100 discount per plot when purchasing 2 or more at the same time.
- Non-members \$1,400 per plot (no discounts given). Non-members must be relatives of a Trinity member in order to purchase plots.


