"White As Snow"

"Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool." – Isaiah 1:18

After the big snowstorms of November and December, I wouldn't blame you if you were done with all of this snow. I read that the Buffalo area averages about 99 inches of snow per season, and we had already hit that average by the start of January, with much more snow to come. But I'm one of those strange people who prefers snow to rain. Part of the reason for this, for me, is that rain tends to make things muddy, wet and messy in a way that snow just doesn't. There is something beautiful about falling snow as it lights up the air all around.

One of the benefits of fresh snow is that it covers up the mud and dirty snow that has accumulated over the past weeks. This reminds me of a truth from the Bible, from the Old Testament book of Isaiah, where God says, "Though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be white as snow."

Snow, then, takes for us an additional meaning. It draws us to one of the great promises of God, in which he offers us forgiveness of sin. This is such a comfort for sinful people like you and me. Although we are stained by our own guilt and sin, stained so deep that we cannot wash it away ourselves, God promises to wash us clean, make us white, white as snow.

Looking out of the window as I write this, it is snowing. Freshly fallen, white snow is covering up dirt, and footprints and leaves from the fall. All I see is smooth and white. It is uncontaminated. Because of Jesus, our Savior, that's what God sees when he looks at us. He does not see the times we have disobeyed him or broken his commandments. He doesn't see when we have neglected to do the good we ought to have done and have failed to do. He sees us as clean and pure. He sees the hard-won grace of Jesus reflected in us.

Yes, even though we may be tired of the snow, it is a helpful reminder of the grace we have in Jesus Christ.


Trinity School News

Thrivent Action Team Grants at Trinity School

Did you know that we regularly use Thrivent Action Team Grants at the school? Here are some ways we have used them this year to help us spread God's love:

- **Grandparents Day** We were able to invite 100 grandparents to the school to do activities with them. We also were able to have them worship with us in chapel. It is so important to build faith relationships between grandchildren and grandparents!
- **Puerto Rico missions** The fifth and sixth graders were able to purchase Christmas gifts for the ministry team that works with LCMS missionary, Ruth Maita and her family. How encouraging it was for the ministry team to be encouraged and showered with gifts from children at Trinity!
- Neighborhood prayer walk Every year for National Lutheran Schools Week, the students at Trinity pray for our neighbors and make them Christian crafts. This event helped spread the wonderful message of Jesus' birth. It was a fun night of worship, crafts, and pizza! Thrivent allowed the necessary supplies to be purchased.

Joshua Makey is the eldest son of Brian and Ellen Makey and was raised here at Trinity, West Seneca. Joshua graduated from Trinity Christian School in 2002 and was confirmed the same year by Rev. Ron Habedank. He attended Orchard Park High School, graduating in 2006. He went on to attend Concordia College – New York where he received a bachelor's degree in Middle Childhood Education and a Lutheran Teacher's Diploma in 2010. Joshua taught at Lutheran schools for three years before beginning seminary training, during which time he met his future wife, Sarah. A Stephen Ministry Story

Sent by God, Just for Me

Twas 26, newly divorced, living far away from family and friends, and dealing with a lot of guilt, shame, and low self-esteem. Was I a total failure? Would anybody ever want me? Was God condemning me because of my divorce?

I found a new church and made some friends, but still struggled. It seemed like all my church friends were perfect, happy, and full of faith—while I was flawed, gloomy, and full of doubts.

When I shared some of this with my pastor, he suggested a Stephen Minister.

Before I met my Stephen Minister, I was worried she would judge and reject me once she learned about my past and got to know the real me. But she didn't. She was patient, loving, and accepting. I truly believe she was sent by God just for me.

We got together weekly. She'd ask me questions, get me talking, and then listen as I shared my struggles and doubts. She showed me God's love even when I didn't feel it. Over time, her faithful care helped me to see that perhaps I wasn't such a terrible person after all. Through her loving care, I began to think that if God loved me, then maybe I could love myself too.

After a while, I got to a better place emotionally, and our Stephen Ministry relationship ended. A few years later, I remarried and had a miscarriage, and she was there for me again as a Stephen Minister, providing the care and support I needed. We now live over a thousand miles apart—but she will always hold a special place in my heart.



If you're dealing with any kind of difficulty, if you're struggling with faith questions or doubts, if you're wondering whether you are a worthy person, then I encourage you to consider getting a Stephen Minister.

It just might be that God already has a special one picked out just for you.
