"How To Avoid The Post-Easter Lull"

We spend so much time preparing for Easter. We spend 40 days during Lent preparing our hearts and minds. We plan Easter egg hunts, Easter family dinners, and fill Easter baskets for kids or grand-kids. There is so much to do and celebrate. And rightly so! 1 Corinthians 15:57 tells us, "Thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." We have the victory and we celebrate at Easter.

Personally, there is always a strange lull that comes over me after Easter. There is a slowing down in the time period between Easter and the large number of summer activities. I'm not the type of person for whom taking a breather is natural. I struggle to take a break. I'm sure I'm not alone. There always feels like there is something more we can do, even when there's not. But maybe finding busy work is not what God wants for us during this time. What if God intends this time after the Christmas and Easter seasons to be a time of "Sabbath" rest, growing closer to him. What if all we are intended to do during this time is regroup, reflect and rejoice in all that He is and all that He has done for us.

Maybe this "post-Easter lull" is also a time to reconnect with Christ, reconnect with others and connecting others to Christ. Paul seems to emphasize this idea in Philemon 1:6 saying, "I pray that the sharing of your faith may become effective for the full knowledge of every good thing that is in us for the sake of Christ." Paul uses the word "koinonia" for "sharing your faith"; another translation would be fellowship, caring for those close to you. Paul is suggesting here that by engaging in this "post-Easter" fellowship we are putting the Easter experiences we have had to their proper use: fellowship with one another for our good and for Christ's sake. Therefore, let us use this upcoming time "post-Easter", this celebratory victory lap, as a way to practically demonstrate how Christ has worked in us. Not by busying ourselves, but by taking time to regroup and rejoice in this world he redeemed and the people he has placed in our lives.

Carrying a Butterfly

"Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

Ephesians 4:32 (NIV)

A neat thing about living along the Gulf Coast is that every September, I get to see swarms of Gulf fritillaries. We have their host plant, the passion vine, growing along our fence line. As the whimsical purple flower open toward the sun, the butterflies seem to come from north, south, east and west. Then they lay eggs, and a new generation of butterflies is born. I love watching the orange caterpillars, with their menacing black spikes, and the beautiful butterflies they become.

Last week, a cold front came through and brought with it some heavy winds. My son and I were playing outside during a break in the rain, and as we were running, I noticed an old butterfly with worn wings climbing up a tall blade of grass amid the storm. I reached out with care, and it climbed onto my finger. Naturally, I thought about keeping it forever, but instead, I used my other hand to block the wind from its wings while I searched for a better spot in the yard for the butterfly. I settled on a thick bush full of flowers, where it could get nectar and burrow between the leaves as needed between gusts of wind.

The butterfly immediately unrolled its wings and began to drink from the flower, as I stood in awe that for the second time in two weeks, a butterfly had crawled into my hand. I thought about how a similar principle holds true with the people around me. Sometimes, when the winds of life pick up, others who are struggling may be more apt to accept encouragement or help. I hope and pray that I'm able to see them and take the opportunity to block the wind for a little while. May I always remember the difference I can make in other' lives.

Environmental Stewardship

We are called by God to be stewards of His creation (Gen. 2:15).

There are many ways to manage the environment in which we live. We enjoy the trees, flowers and fresh produce and most of us enjoy the outdoors, especially on a sunny day. But do you consider that the way in which mankind uses the resources in the environment has a great deal to do with the sustainability of it? Most of us have heard about greenhouse gases and pollution of air, land and water. WE are a part of producing all that. How can YOU participate in mitigating that pollution?

REDUCTION: For a start, how about buying less. Do you really need 10 pairs of jeans, shoes, you name it? Can you continue to use your old phone, laptop, toaster, automobile? Have you bought more food than you and your family can consume? Do you really NEED that item? (You may even save some hard-earned money!) Maybe you can borrow that tool/item. Try to use fewer disposable items.

REUSE: Get items repaired if possible. Check out second hand options. What have you stored away, that you can rediscover? Or, if you are not using an item, donate it to a reuse organization (ie., LADD, Habitat for Humanity).

RECYCLE: Many municipalities and towns have recycling programs, but you have to *participate* by separating the appropriate trash. Towns and county governments have special days on which hazardous wastes are collected. Check web sites for times and locations. It's possible to search online for businesses which recycle electronics and components.

DISPOSAL: Throw it out only as a last resort and do it in a sustainable method. DO NOT COMTAMINATE THE SOIL, AIR OR WATER with waste oil or other chemicals.

Use this WASTE MANAGEMENT HIERARCHY to become and effective environmental sustainer.

Isaiah 51:6 "Lift up your eyes to the heavens, look at the earth beneath; the heavens will vanish like smoke, the earth will wear out like a garment and its inhabitants die like flies. But my salvation will last forever, my righteousness will ever fail.
