Dear Trinity Family,

This Advent and Christmas season we are once more reminded that Jesus came to us in the flesh. This year we are exploring how Jesus revealed his divine nature to us through the description of physical substances we experience on earth. He wanted to make this vast concept more concrete so we could begin to comprehend it. The theme tying this entire season together is found in John 1:14 "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth."

Jesus taught this truth by using tangible substances which we will discuss each week:

- Week 1: Bread of Life Jesus is born in Bethlehem, the House of Bread, to nourish and strengthen us in our faith and feed us with his Word of truth to fill our lives. *Theme verse: "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me shall not hunger, and whoever believes in me shall never thirst." John 6:35*
- Week 2: Salt of the Earth Jesus calls us to flavor the earth and to savor the good things that come from him through his birth. *Theme verse: "You are the salt of the earth." Matthew 5:13*
- Week 3: Rock of Ages Jesus is our rock, a solid foundation on which to build a life of joy. *Theme verse:* "Look to the rock from which you were hewn, and to the quarry from which you were dug." Isaiah 51:1
- Week 4: Light of the World Jesus brightens our lives through his birth, dispelling the darkness of sin to bring forgiveness to light. Theme verse: "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." John 8:12
- Christmas Eve: Born in a Manger We celebrate and ponder the humble birth of Jesus as he rests in a manger bed of straw, though he is the Son of God. *Theme verse: "And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger." Luke 2:7*
- Christmas Day: Crowned with Glory We rejoice that the little Lord Jesus asleep in our hay is our King of Kings forevermore. Theme Verse: "At the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth." Philippians 2:10

Join us this advent and Christmas season to discover or discover anew the fullness of God dwelling among us as the Word Made Flesh.



"How Do I Pray With Someone?"

In one of my last articles, I mentioned offering to praying for someone is a great way to connect with them. It builds relationship and trust, and obviously takes that person directly to God who can help them in their situation. This could lead to opportunity for more God conversations or inviting them to church.

I remember it really used to make me nervous praying out loud, with another person or in a group. I never knew what to say or how to structure my thoughts. Over time, and the more you do something, the more comfortable you become because you settle into it and have naturally figured out a way that works for you.

So here's what works for me ... First I start with addressing God. Then I move into a line or two of thanks - and I think God appreciates that too as we're not just going right into the request or what we're asking for. Then, I ask God specifically to help with what ever the issue is that I or my friend needs help with. Then a line or two of more thanks or focus on who God is or his attributes.

Here's what it could sound like: "You mind if I pray for you? (Friend says "sure")...

Gracious father, thank you for the friendship that I have with Sergey. I always appreciate how you give us time together to talk and interact. And Lord, as you've heard in our conversation, he needs Your help. As his surgery is coming up in a few days, I ask that You would give him a sense of peace and calmness. Help him to know that however this goes You are still in control. And You want what is best for him in the long run. Please guide the doctors through the operation, and bring Sergey back to good health. You are an awesome God. And we know that You can do all things. In Your name, Amen."

It's so very worth it. Yes, practice and the more you do it makes it more comfortable and natural feeling. Here's a few pointers ... Ask your friend if you can pray for them. Take a breath and a brief pause before beginning. Sometimes you just have to stumble through it and that's ok. God will really honor your effort and it also shows the person your praying for, your sincerity and concern. At rare times, and depending on what the subject is, I've gotten emotional and that's ok too. Feel free to take brief moments to wipe the tears, take a breath or two and gain composure. Imagine you're God's child, going to the Father who deeply cares and wants to help. And this is absolutely true.

These are some of the things we talk about in our "Reaching Out" small group that gets together every other week. The simple goal of this group is to encourage each other and to learn ways to become more comfortable having God conversations with people and inviting them to church. We're a no pressure group. There's currently 6 of us and you can join any time so see or contact me, Mark Willert, if you're interested (716) 601-8570.

Stephen Ministers Offer Emotional and Spiritual Support in Times of Trouble

Mary Larrabee's life was a mess. Her marriage had just ended in divorce, she underwent two major surgeries, and then her grown son was murdered.

"As a friend of mine put it, the manure truck just kept backing up and dumping on me," Larrabee said.

Then she heard about Stephen Ministry at her church.

The ministry matches specially trained members of a congregation with people going through a tough time. Nationwide, more than 10,000 churches representing more than 150 different Christian denominations offer Stephen Ministry.

Larrabee was matched with Stephen Minister Kathy Ames, a fellow member of North Naples United Methodist Church, and the two met once a week for more than a year.



"I'm stronger and I know how precious every day is," says Mary Larrabee, right, who was helped with a life crisis by her Stephen Minister Kathy Ames. "She would hold my hand and let me spill out my heart. I call her my earth angel."

"She would hold my hand and let me spill out my heart," Larrabee said of Ames. "I call her my earth angel. She really helped me through a hard time in my life. She didn't give me specific advice as much as she just listened to me and validated my pain."

Now that the formal Stephen Ministry relationship has ended, the two remain friends.

"I will always be grateful to her for all of her prayers and all that she did to help me," Larrabee said.

Stephen Ministry began in St. Louis in 1975 when the Rev. Kenneth Haugk, a pastor and clinical psychologist, found he was unable to meet the needs of all the people in his congregation. He trained nine laypeople in his church to assist him in providing Christian care to people who needed encouragement.

It went so well that Haugk began training Stephen Ministers in other congregations. That, in turn, led to the establishment of the Stephen Series Leader's Training Course, which trains pastors and lay leaders to go back to their congregations and train others to become Stephen Ministers.

"We train the trainers," said Joel Bretscher, Director of Communications at the Stephen Ministries headquarters in St. Louis. "We train the Stephen Leaders who then go home to train the Stephen Ministers in the congregation." Stephen Ministers then provide one-to-one emotional and spiritual care to people in need.

The name Stephen comes from St. Stephen, who was the first layperson commissioned by the Apostles to provide caring ministry to those in need, Bretscher said.

"Ordained pastors often find there are more needs for care than they can provide, so Stephen Ministers are there to supplement, but not replace, pastoral care," Bretscher said.

In Stephen Ministry, women are matched with women and men are

matched with men. It is also important to note that Stephen Ministers are available to care for anyone in the community who is hurting, not just church members, said Becky Jarrell, Director of Congregational Care at North Naples United Methodist Church.

"We are here for anyone experiencing a life crisis, whether it's death, divorce, illness, relocation, financial difficulty or whatever the need," Jarrell said. "It enriches the church to have this consistent outreach available to anyone in the community who needs help."

"It's a wonderful thing to see God working in people's lives."

Over the past eight years, North Naples United Methodist Church has trained more than 60 people to become Stephen Ministers, she said. At Community Congregational Church in Naples, there are more than 20 active Stephen Ministers, said Gini Reinhold, Director of Congregational Care.

"The Stephen Minister is there to walk with you throughout your crisis and to help you see that, with God's love, you will be okay," Reinhold said.

Stephen Ministers go through 50 hours of training and commit to serving for two years. Most choose to serve much longer after they find they get as much out of the ministry as they give, Reinhold said.

"It's a wonderful thing to see God working in people's lives," she said. "There's something special about knowing that God has put you in a certain place at a certain time to help a certain person. Stephen Ministers grow a lot as a result."

Patty Lengemann knows what it's like to be on both sides of the fence. She had her own Stephen Minister about five years ago when she went through a divorce.

"I know how wonderful it is to give and receive," Lengemann said.

"My Stephen Minister gave me the courage to start over again. Now I want to give something back."

"The Stephen Minister is there to walk with you through your crisis and to help you see that, with God's love, you will be okay."

Lengemann, a member at Community Congregational, has had two care receivers since she became a Stephen Minister.

"So far, I've been matched with people going through the same kind of pain I experienced, so I'm able to identify with what they're going through," she said. "I'm able to share my experience with them and help them to see that, when God closes one door, he opens another."
